PTA EASTER DISCO

The PTA met again on Tuesday night to discuss plans for a pre-Easter school disco, a P7 leavers 'Big Picnic' and a summer celebration. The pre-Easter discos will be held in school on Tuesday 26th March. From Monday all children can purchase a ticket (from their teacher) to attend either a classroom film show, or to attend a disco in the assembly hall. The P1-P3 disco will run from 9.30 am to 10.15 am and the P4 to P7 disco will run from 10.45 am to 11.45 am. Most of the ticket money will be used to fund the DJ and the treats but any additional money will be presented to Autism NI.
