NSPCC WORKSHOPS

We are pleased to inform you that we are participating in the **NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe.** Programme this term. Speak out. Stay safe is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline.

This child friendly programme is aligned with the curriculum and consists of age appropriate virtual assemblies and supporting classroom based activities which we have reviewed, alongside NSPCC volunteer led face to face workshops for children aged 6-7 and 9-11. Our workshops will be in P3, P6 and P7 and we will be writing to the parents of the children in those classes to provide you with further detail in advance of the workshops. PTE/PTM TESTING

Next week our P3, P4, P5, P6 and P7 children will be completing progress tests in maths and English. These are not tests that the children can revise for. They are annual tests used by the majority of schools to measure each child's individual progress since they were last tested. Please be aware that this is happening next week, try to avoid unnecessary absences and reassure your child that they simply need to give each assessment their best effort.

NATIONAL NUMERACY DAY

National Numeracy Day is a national campaign that takes place every May, encouraging adults and children to build their confidence and skills with maths. The vision is for everyone in the UK to get on with numbers so they can get on in life., a vision that aligns perfectly with our own new school vision of *Nuturing Minds, Shaping Futures!*

This year National Numeracy Day is on Wednesday 22nd May and during that day all of our classes will be engaging in work that is focused on improving how our children understand and work with numbers in day-to-day life – sparking better opportunities and brighter futures.

On National Numeracy Day, where possible, we are encouraging the children to come to school in an item of clothing that includes a number, but please do not think you are expected to go and buy something new. This is just a little bit of extra fun to emphasise the fact that it is a special, numeracy-focused day in Edenderry.
