SJF Transition Arrangements – A Reminder

Our plans have been approved by Sheffield Public Health but remain subject to change and even cancellation by Sheffield Public Health if the developing situation with the Delta variant becomes a problem. Our 'Moving Up Day' is on Wednesday 7th July 2021. All children up to Y5 will have an opportunity to spend time in their new classrooms with their new teachers. Children in Y6 currently will be based in the School Hall and in other spaces, including outside. Please note that on Moving Up Day, we would like the young people in Years **3**, **4** and **6** to come to school wearing their PE uniform. Thank you.

The children will not access their current classes, as we still need to keep bubbles separate in line with guidance. All areas will be cleaned before children to return to their own classes. Staff continue to work with all children to prepare them for Moving Up Day, and especially with our most vulnerable, and any who tend to struggle with change. Our aim is that they all are able to enjoy the day.

SJF Transition to FS2

Information has been sent out to all the parents and carers of our new FS2 children. It is also available on our SJF website (by clicking <u>here</u>). Thank you to everyone who was able to attend our live online meeting on Wednesday. The meeting has been recorded and is available to those unable to attend.

Children joining us in September are invited to attend one of three taster sessions being run by our team next week on Wednesday 7th July 2021. The sessions are timed (a) so that the space can be cleaned thoroughly between sessions and (b) so that the children can be kept separate from other children. The timings are:

9.30am – 11.00am → Group A

1.30pm – 3.00pm → Group B

4.00pm – 5.30pm → Group C

New starters have been allocated a taster session. Unfortunately, due to restrictions, these cannot be rearranged for children unable to attend the one allocated to them. As part of the plan agreed with the Public Health Team, parents/carers are asked to keep us informed if their children (or any member of their households) test positive, exhibit symptoms, or are required to isolate before the taster day. This could mean that a child might not be allowed to visit, but protecting public health by keeping this variant out of school remains our chief priority at this time.

As mentioned, during their time with us, all visiting children will be kept separate from other pupils (including older siblings if they have them) and will spend the majority of their time with us in our FS2 *outside* learning areas. They should therefore come to school wearing comfortable and appropriate clothing for the weather and for being outside.



Parents/carers are asked to arrive at least **ten minutes** before their child's allocated FS2 taster session and queue with their children from the pedestrian gate along the pavement in front of our staff/visitor car park. There are markings painted on railings at two metres intervals, as a guide to help those queuing to maintain social distancing. We ask that parents/carers also wear face coverings whilst waiting in the line. A member of staff will greet queuing parents/carers in turn and ask each to confirm that, to the best of their knowledge, no members of their households are isolating, symptomatic or have tested positive. Once this has been done, the visiting children will be welcomed by FS2 staff and escorted to the FS2 area via the school playground.

Unfortunately, parents/carers will not be able to enter school or join their children for the taster session.

In lieu of the fact that there has been no residential educational visit for our Y6 children this year, we have decided to host a sleepover for them as part of their end of term leaving celebrations! It will take place next Friday 9th until Saturday 10th July 2021. It will be open to all Y6 children and there will be no charge. Children can also opt to stay for the evening and leave without sleeping over, if they prefer.

We intend to welcome the children from 7.00pm on the Friday evening. Children who need to join us later e.g. because they are attending the Confirmation Mass at our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church, can do so. We will provide pizzas, hotdogs and snacks later in the evening, but your child might need/want an evening meal at home before they come.

Y6-Led Mass of Thanksgiving
