PE Uniform

Please note that children are expected to come to school wearing their PE uniform on PE days. The official items can be purchased, with logos, from either supplier. If parents/carers opt to source items from elsewhere they must be absolutely plain with no logos, slogans or other embellishments. **No designer labels e.g. Nike, Puma or Adidas etc.** The sweatshirt must be plain maroon/burgundy and the bottoms must be **plain light** grey joggers. **No leggings.**

Earrings and Jewellery

A reminder that children are **not** permitted to wear earrings/studs or any kind of jewellery at school. The wearing of sensible watches is encouraged.

School Shoes

Whilst trainers/high boots **can** be worn to/from school e.g. in bad weather or to play football **at break-times**, pupils are expected to wear proper school shoes in school i.e. **NO** high boots or trainers (even all black ones).



(except on PE days and for break-times)

Medication

No medication will be given to children unless a full care plan has been completed first. Only once the care plan has been completed will designated staff administer medicine to children, in line with the instructions printed on the medication. We will require an official note from a health professional (acting in an official capacity) that details any changes to the care plan so that we know that we are acting in strict accordance with medical instruction. It is the responsibility of parents/carers to ensure that the medicines supplied to school for their children are in date. This includes liquid medication, tablets, asthma inhalers and epi-pens. Please contact us and speak to Mr Smith (our Learning Mentor) if you would like to check or you have any questions.

Pupil Premium Grant

If you are (or have been) in receipt of benefits of one kind or another then your child(ren) might be entitled to a **Pupil Premium Grant** and **free school meals**. The grant is also available to children in care and those with parents serving in the UK armed forces.

The grant provides school with additional funding to support vulnerable children. It is therefore very important that you tell us. Please make sure you claim even if your child is in FS2/Y1/Y2 and receives free school meals through a separate arrangement anyway. Please speak in confidence to Mrs Ramsden or Mrs Birch in order to find out more. Thank you.

Our Additional Charity for 2021-2022: Bluebell Wood Children's Hospice

The dream of Bluebell Wood Children's Hospice began in 1998, with the vision to help families in this area who wanted an alternative to hospital care. Fundraising started when 11-year-old Richard and his mum wanted him to pass away at home.

In 2004, everyone's support made the dream come true and they began to build the hospice. On 19th September 2008, the doors opened to the first families who needed help.

Since then, the hospice has supported hundreds of children from across South Yorkshire, North Derbyshire, North Nottinghamshire and parts of North Lincolnshire.



"We've helped tired mums and dads get some much needed me-time; looked after brothers and sisters who are feeling angry, lonely or confused; and been there for families during the last moments of their child's life. Without fundraising, our support over the years just wouldn't have been possible: your donations have paid for every day trip, and funded every session of sensory play. But our life-changing care doesn't stop now. We want to reach even more families, and show them all the fantastic things we can offer."
