ENGLISH

Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

All children will benefit from having daily handwriting and spelling practise and regular grammar and punctuation sessions focused on individual needs. We will also focus on children's individual writing targets.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ continuing to practice weekly spellings
- ✓ describing everyday objects in exciting ways

Reciprocal reading

All children will have daily access to reading resources and will be completing reciprocal reading each day which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ reading texts together at home
- ✓ asking questions about different texts you read together and discussing what has happened and why
- ✓ having a go at predicting what will happen next when reading a story together
- ✓ trying to summarise what has just been read – remembering that a summary covers just the main points

MATHEMATICS

This term we will focus on:

- measurement in different contexts and ways
- multiplication and division

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ multiplying and dividing numbers you may see in day to day life
- ✓ encouraging and helping them to practise, **practise**, PRACTISE, **PRACTISE** their times tables
- ✓ talking about what division is and how they can work it out using the inverse operation.

HUMANITIES

This term we are learning about the Romans. We will investigate why the Romans were great conquerors and explore what they did for Britain. The children will learn about invasions, Roman deity and wider Roman society.

- ✓ discussing different ways that we can learn about the past and consider how different forms of historical evidence can help us do this

PE

We will focus on elements of our Jasmine 'Real' PE programme and Tag Rugby.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ discussing what they have been learning in lessons and asking them to teach you a skill they are learning

Science

During our 'Light' topic we will be learning what light is and how it travels. We will study shadows and how they are affected by light levels.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ investigating different light sources in your home
- ✓ looking at your shadows when outside and how they may change

Music

This term, we will be exploring playing the keyboard. We will learn all about the instruments history and how to play it correctly. We will explore playing a variety of music using the Keyboard.

Key words we will be using are:

Art and DT

We will be investigate the part played by perspective in landscapes, as we use powder paint to replicate the style and works of different artists. We will learn how to create depth within our work and then practise these techniques as we take inspiration from the contrasting styles of Jacob More and Andy Warhol.

This term we will continue exploring our theme of 'respect'. We will focus on how important it is to respect others and to understand differing viewpoints. We will also explore how we can take personal responsibility for our environment and actions we can take to limit damage to our world.
