#### **ENGLISH**

#### Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

All children will benefit from having daily handwriting and spelling practise and regular grammar and punctuation sessions focused on individual needs. We will also focus on children's individual writing targets.

#### You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ supporting them to learn their weekly spellings
- ✓ looking at synonyms and antonyms.
- ✓ talking about their targets for writing

#### Reciprocal reading

All children will have daily access to reading resources and twice each week will be completing reciprocal reading which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

#### You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ reading their own books with them for a few minutes every day
- $\checkmark$  choosing another book by the same author, to read with your child
- ✓ encouraging your child to read a wider range of more challenging books, to widen their experience
- ✓ discussing their personal targets for reading (as shared on their record sheet)

#### **MATHEMATICS**

The children will be focusing on:

- shapes and symmetry looking at angles and classifying them as 'acute', 'obtuse' or 'right angles'
- 3-D shapes we will be looking at properties of shapes and adding to the shapes learnt in year 3.
- position and direction we will be looking at coordinates and translating on a grid

#### **HUMANITIES**

The children will focus mountains and the water cycle. We will look at the topography of Greece and compare different aspects to the UK. The children will be learning about the geographical features of both places and compare them. They will identify how changes to a place will affect people living there and understand how people can work to improve their different environments.

The children will benefit from a programme called Real PE. This term the children will focus on Athletics.

#### **SCIENCE**

We will be learning that materials come in three states of matter: solid, liquid or gas. They identify materials as solids, liquids or gases, including some that are harder to classify such as sand or sponge. They learn how to use a thermometer and investigate changes of state. They learn about the water cycle.

#### ART & DT

As we focus on cartoon-looking art, we will explore the works of Andy Warhol and Pete McKee, contrasting these with works by other artists, including, Matt Groening and Albert Underzo. We will investigate how colours can be used to contrast and complement one another and then attempt to use and apply this knowledge, and our developing skills, in pieces of our own artwork that celebrate contrasting and complementing colours.
