Any SJF pupils who have made their First Holy Communion this year can wear their special First Holy Communion clothes to Mass, if they wish. The First Holy communicants should come to school wearing their school uniform and bring their special clothes with them. They will have private spaces to get ready and will be supervised as they get changed, either on their own or with the help of their parents and carers. Parents/carers wishing to get their children ready can come in to school from 9.20am. They can also come back in to school after Mass to help their children to get changed back in to their school uniform.

Reminder: Transition Moving Up Days

A reminder that the children will have three 'moving up' days this year, to coincide with the Y6 to Y7 transition days organised by All Saints Catholic High School for the Y6 children transferring there. The transition days take place on Monday 3rd July, Tuesday 4th July and Wednesday 5th July 2023.

Y6 pupils *not* transferring to All Saints Catholic High School must come to school as usual and will do a range of academic and pastoral transition work that will help and support them with transitions to their new schools.

There is a huge focus on preparing and supporting all the children and especially those who struggle most with change. As part of this the children will benefit from short visits before the transition days and on the Friday before <u>all</u> the children will be shown where to go on their first transition day.

On the first transition day (03-07-23), after 'Wake Up Shake Up', the children will be guided by staff to the new classrooms where they will be based for the transition days. Staff will be on hand to help any child who has forgotten where to go, or who might require a little extra support and encouragement.

Please note that times for lunch and the end of the day will be the same as the children's current classes. PE days will also be the same as the children's <u>current</u> classes:

• Monday 3 rd July 2023	FS2 children who are moving to Y1 in September 2023
• Tuesday 4 th July 2023	Y1 and Y2 children who will be moving to <mark>Y2</mark> and <mark>Y3</mark> in September 2023
• Wednesday 5 th July 2023	Y3 and Y4 children who will be moving to <mark>Y4</mark> and <mark>Y5</mark> in September 2023

New FS2 Children

The brand new FS2 children joining us in September 2023 will also have taster sessions on **Tuesday 4th July 2023** and **Wednesday 5th 2023**. Their transition will also be supported with visits to nurseries and other pre-school setting, home visits and a meeting to welcome their parents and carers, here at school on **Monday 12th June 2023** starting at **6.00pm**. It will be a formal welcome to our school and an opportunity for them to meet the key staff they will come across, as well as Governors and PTFA representatives. They will find out about our school and routines, how to order lunches, uniform and pay for things etc.


