He really has established himself as both a highly effective and respected member of the team and will, of course, leave with all our best wishes, thanks and prayers for his exciting new beginning. We are now in the process of recruiting a successor and hope to have someone suitable in post for the start of the new academic year.






# SJF Moving Up Days

Our three 'moving up' days this year take place next week on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July, Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July and Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July 2023.

NEU industrial action means that Y6 pupils transferring to All Saints Catholic High School in September will now have two, instead of three, transition days, and will attend our school, as normal, on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July 2023. Y6 pupils not transferring to All Saints Catholic High School in September will also come to school as normal next week, unless they are attending transition days/events in their new schools.

Today, all children visited their new classrooms, in preparation, and in the days and weeks leading up to the first transition day, vulnerable pupils have been visiting new rooms and meeting new staff, as often as has possible, so they feel more reassured and prepared. Obviously, Miss Lockham and Mrs Hambleton have not yet had the opportunity to meet any children yet, but they will make time to get to know all the children, including those who might feel more anxious about changing year-groups, next week.

After 'Wake Up Shake Up' on the first transition day (03-07-23), the children will be guided by staff on the playground to go straight to their new classrooms where they will be based. Staff will be available to help anyone who has forgotten where to go, or who might require a little extra support and encouragement. Please note that times for lunch and the end of the day will be the same as the children's current classes. PE days will also be the same as the children's <u>current</u> classes:
