Dear Parents and Carers,

This is the first curriculum overview of our new school year. Its purpose is to tell you about our curriculum and all the things your children will be learning during this first term. We will also offer suggestions for supporting your children at home.

New learning can be fragile which is why it important to give our children the right kind of support in school and at home. If we get it right our children will feel positive and confident as they learn and make progress.

Homework is set to support and consolidate this new learning - and to encourage the children. It is important that homework is attempted by children on their own. If they do not understand something **they should not worry**. Simply offer them reassurance and encourage them to do what they can. This will help us to understand what they remember and know, so that any gaps can be pinpointed and targeted with the right support.

If the children have done their best we will always be proud of them. If your child is stuck then please let us know. You can speak to someone in the office; let the teacher know via the class email; or send in a note. Remember to say (i) what they remembered; (ii) what they could do; and (iii) what they struggled with. We will then follow it up with lots and lots of reassurance and the right kind of support.

Please avoid the temptation to 'over-help' your children with homework tasks because this could end up masking a gap and delay the children getting the help they need. Just offer encouragement and keep telling them that everyone at school will understand and help and support them.

We know that ways of teaching and learning change over time and so we are **always** happy to explain our approaches if you are not sure and have questions. Please just ask. Children can find it very confusing if parents/carers try to show them what they remember being taught at school, especially if this is different to our approach.

As always, please contact us if you can offer support with any aspect of the curriculum overview perhaps because you have particular skills, knowledge or experiences, artefacts, useful contacts or you would like to volunteer to help us on an educational visit. Thank you for your support.

ENGLISH

Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

All children will benefit from a regular focus on handwriting, spelling, grammar and punctuation sessions focused on meeting their individual needs in these specific areas and in writing too.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ practising spellings through games and online games and competitions
- ✓ using the games in your child's 'Spelling Journal' to support them in learning this spellings
- ✓ practise the Year 5 and Year 6 statutory spelling list

Reciprocal Reading

All children will have daily access to reciprocal reading which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ continuing to encourage your child to be independent when reading
- ✓ reading with your child everyday
- √ going through reading questions and checking answers particularly using the Bug Club resource









MATHEMATICS

This term we will focus on:

- place value, including ordering and comparing numbers up to and beyond 1,000,000
- addition and subtraction using a range of methods
- developing methods to solve a range of word problems based upon addition and subtraction methods
- ensuring we know our times tables so we can use the number facts in other areas of mathematics

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ practising and learning by heart multiplication tables (Times Tables Rock Stars)

HUMANITIES

We will be learning about World War I. We shall study the political and cultural events that lead to the outbreak of the war, the life of civilians and soldiers during this time and how its impact set the scene for the rise of Nazism and ultimately the Second World War. This will link to our visit to the National Holocaust Museum later in the academic year.

The children will continue to benefit from our REAL PE programme as they focus on physical co-ordination and balance. The children will also be undertaking a unit of PE based upon Ball Skills.

SCIENCE

In Term 1, we will investigate the parts of the human circulatory system and learn about the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. We consider the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way bodies function and investigate how food and water is digested.

MUSIC

In this unit, the children will be studying film and television music and learning about the different ways music can create emotion to expand or enhance a scene. The children will also learn to play the 'Doctor Who' theme on glockenspiel and, in small groups, create their own arrangement of the 'Doctor Who' theme music. Finally, the children will learn about leitmotif and the effect that this has on the music from the 'Star Wars' series. In starters and plenaries, the children will sing a variety of rounds in three or four parts. The children will watch, listen and discuss a range of music from across both film and television, always thinking about why a composer has chosen to use this particular piece or style of music. The children will learn to play the main theme from 'Jurassic Park' on glockenspiels and, as a class, create a piece of incidental music based around this theme for a scene from the film.
