#### The National Holocaust Centre

A reminder that the children of  $\frac{1}{16}$  will have their annual visit to Beth Shalom, near Ollerton, Nottinghamshire, on Thursday 25th January 2024. Holocaust Memorial Day (HMD) takes place on 27th January each year and is a time to remember all victims of genocide, including those persecuted and murdered by Nazis during the Holocaust; as well as in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur (Sudan).

The theme this year is around the fragility of freedom. Please click here to find out more. Its commemoration in our school alians with both our British values and Catholic ethos, and provides us all with an opportunity to reflect and understand how the lessons of the past can inform our lives today to ensure that everyone continues to work together in order to create a safer and better future for our children. Click here to find out why HMD is marked in schools and elsewhere.

It is important that lessons are learned in age-appropriate ways because it is not inevitable that these terrible events of the past will not happen again and again and again. Educating our young to be accepting and respectful of others - of difference - is absolutely key, and wholly in line with our Catholic ethos and values.

Despite knowing she would likely be murdered if caught, she built a false partition into a large wardrobe to hide people. #### Yorkshire Farming Museum

A reminder that the children of Y3 and Y4 will travel up to the Yorkshire Farming Museum at Murton Park, near York, on Friday 19th January 2024 for a special immersive and interactive day that will enable them to explore and engage more closely with the lives of ordinary Roman and Viking settlers. This will support their learning as part of these exciting history topics.

Our Y6 children will visit London on Friday 8th February 2024, the last day of Term 3. Leaving school at 6.00am, the children will travel down to the South Bank for a visit to the London Eye. They will then walk along the South Bank, past the old County Hall and over Westminster Bridge, taking in the sights, as they make their way to the Houses of parliament, and more specifically the Education Centre close to the Victoria Tower.

Once through security the children will be guided on a tour of the Palace of Westminster. They will view the King's robing room, the Lords' Common Room, the House of Lords, Central Lobby, the House of Commons and Westminster Hall, the oldest part of the palace, where our late Queen laid in state.

Next, the children will walk down to the Embankment, past New Scotland Yard, to catch a river bus, that will take them down the River Thames, past Cleopatra's Needle, The London Eye and various other famous landmarks to Tower Pier, next to Traitors' Gate, at the Tower of London. As they disembark the children will see HMS Belfast and Tower Bridge. They will then visit the Tower of London complex, which is surprisingly big and spread out, containing the iconic White Tower and Crown Jewels. After what we hope will be a thrilling and interesting day, the children will depart for Sheffield, arriving back at some point later that evening.


