World Earth Day 2024

Monday 22nd April was Earth Day, with this year's theme being **Planet Vs Plastics**. The aim was to encourage governments, organisations and individuals to act to reduce plastic production by 60% by 2040. Each square mile of sea contains more than 46,000 pieces of plastic, with 8 million tons added into the oceans each year.

Mrs Sambrook, our Geography lead, asked everyone to reflect on the theme with children encouraged to share thoughts and ideas around recycling; reducing plastic use; the need to protect God's gifts to us.

Our SJF Eco Team is proud to support Earth Day, and members hope that everyone in our community will get behind the aim of making those small but important changes at home, in order to make a big difference. Some of the questions that were discussed in our lessons included:

- Can we refuse to use plastic cutlery, straws and cups and tell why these items are a problem?
- Can we choose food with no plastic packaging and try to buy plastic-free products?
- Can we take reusable bags with us when we go shopping?
- Can we buy loose products, taking a reusable container with us to the shops to put the items in?
- Can we change to a more 'zero-waste' ways of thinking? e.g. using bamboo toothbrushes instead of plastic


