Assessments Reminders

I would like to congratulate the young people of Y6 who, this week, completed their end of Key Stage 2 statutory assessments. The completed papers have now been collected by the authorities and sent off for external marking. The outcomes will be shared with us, along with grade boundaries in July, once they have gone through a checking and quality assurance process. We will then check each of them carefully, raising questions and appeals if/when appropriate. Once we are satisfied, the results will be shared with families.



We thank Mr MacInnes and all the staff who have worked so hard to support the children throughout the year and during the tests. I would also like to offer thanks to all the staff who have worked with, and supported, our Y6 children in previous years too - those still with us, and those who have moved on.

We thank Mrs Ramsden, Mrs Grayson and Mrs Walton for organising and serving the children with breakfast each morning. It really was really appreciated by all the children, especially the bacon sandwiches!

We thank Fr Bede, and our friends from the parish, for again allowing the children to use the parish hall, so that they could be assured of peace and quiet during their assessments. It is very much appreciated.

Further Assessments

A reminder that the Y6 children now enter a phase where their writing will be assessed formally against national standards. It is therefore key that they do not miss school during this time, as key checks are made and evidence gathered in line with guidelines.

For the children in FS2 there is a sharp focus on their individual journeys and whether they have achieved the national 'Early Learning Goals' in the different areas. Attendance, every day, is therefore vitally important.

For the children of 11 the June National Phonics Screen is approaching fast, and much continues to be done to teach and embed learning around phonics and reading. Good attendance, every day, is absolutely key.









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For the children of Y2, the assessments are no longer statutory, but our school, along with many, have opted to complete non-statutory versions to support our internal judgements and provide the local authority with an overall picture. Conclusions are drawn from the careful assessment of the children's learning and work, supported by the completion of some short tests too. The process is a deliberately gentle one, that will last for the rest of this month and in to June. Attendance every day therefore continues to be very important.


For the children in \(\frac{14}{4} \), there will be a national multiplication tables screening, and much is being done to support each of them. Attendance is key so that they do not miss important opportunities unnecessarily.

The children in Y1, Y2, Y3, Y4 and Y5 will, throughout June, have their writing continuously assessed internally, in a way that aligns with what happens in Y6.

Attendance

The key message is that attendance every day, really does matter, all year, and especially at this time. It should therefore be no surprise that overall, those children with the best attendance feel more confident; learn and retain more; and tend to do better in assessments. Absence leads to children feeling more anxious and worrying about friends and falling behind. We know this because this is what they tell us.

Aside from the fact that the government now sees the improvement of punctuality and attendance as national priorities, introducing new penalties and demanding that local authorities clamp down, the fact is that being at school, every day, when children are well, is just good for them. Avoiding unnecessary absences, including term-time holidays and odd days here and there, really is in your children's best interests, and so we do count on your support and cooperation. Thank you.


