

#### SJF Questionnaire 2023-24

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the annual questionnaire and offer feedback. We received responses from 44 families covering 55 pupils, roughly equivalent to a quarter of our pupil population. You will see that the range of respondents linked to the classes covered is also fairly even too.



As well as answering the questions, a number of respondents were kind enough to take the time to provide additional feedback and share ideas, to help us make our school better. Some shared more personal perspectives around their own experiences along with their views or concerns about the quality of our offer.

We appreciate *all* feedback, and the spirit with which it is shared. It gives us lots to reflect on, whether it confirms a shared understanding of stronger and weaker areas, or whether it highlights areas where perspectives on the same things differ, it is important to know and understand what you think. 







1. My child is happy at this school.




2. My child feels safe at this school.

3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.























# 7a. Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) 44 responses









9. My child does well at this school.




10. The school lets me know how my child is doing. (e.g. interim/full reports, progress meetings, ad hoc meetings etc.).









# 12. My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school.






16. School Governors are effective in explaining what they do.

17. School Governors hold school leaders to account.









#### SJF Eco Team (Mrs Steenson)

During our Transition days, the children of KS2 (Years 3-6) were invited to put their names forward to join next year's SJF Eco Team. They were asked to write or describe their own 'manifestos' outlining why they want to be part of the team, and which areas of environmental concern they are most interested in.



They were first invited to make a simple speech to their classmates, before a vote was taken. The children who will be in next year's Y5 and Y6 classes also made a written application to Mrs Steenson. The children's applications were amazing and Mrs Steenson took time to consider them all very carefully, before selecting two candidates from each class.

The future focus of our SJF Eco Team will be linked to the completion of the wildlife area and on interacting with the 'National Education Nature Park' website, using their app to join in with pollinator counts, collecting data on local bird populations and fundraising to increase these numbers around our school.















Mrs Steenson would like to thank the current team for their enthusiasm, hard work and complete dedication to their role over the last school year. They have had an amazing year, attending meetings with The Environmental Department for the UK Government and the Sheffield Swift Network, as well as planting bulbs in the autumn around school. Mrs Steenson is incredibly proud of this year's team, and all they have achieved!

# Healthy

#### SJF Healthy Minds Team (Mr Murphy)

Children in Y3, Y4 and Y5 (Y4, Y5 and Y6 in September) were invited this week to complete a simple application form in order to apply to become a Healthy Minds Champion within our school, they wanted to.

To be a Healthy Minds Champion, children know that they will need to be friendly, approachable, good communicators, understanding, empathic and welcoming to all. They receive special training for their role which is provided by the Sheffield Healthy Minds Team, and Mr Murphy. Their duties include being 'on duty' twice each week on the playground during break times. They wear special jackets in order to stand out, with the title 'Champion' on the back, and a lanyard too, that contains information to support them in their role.

Children may approach our Healthy Minds champions for a number of reasons, such as feeling sad, upset or after falling out with a friend. Our Healthy Minds Champions will then help them to recognise and understand how they feel and stay with them offering calming or grounding techniques to try to try and help them to feel a bit better and able to think about what they want to do, to tackle the problem on their own or with support.





Our champions also have opportunities to host podcast episodes which are uploaded to our website. They assist with scriptwriting, planning, direction and editing their episode. They learn the process of producing an episode and are taught techniques and skills needed to be a podcast host (click <u>here</u> for an example).

The application process involves the completion of a simple form in which candidates are invited to write a short explanation outlining their motivation and reasons for being a Healthy Minds Champion. Mr Murphy and Mrs Hadfield then read the completed application forms, carefully, before selecting ten applicants to take on the role of Healthy Minds Champion, in the next school year.

We thank our current team for all their hard work, for the dedication they have shown in fulfilling their roles diligently, and reaching out to, and supporting children who need help. They have all been incredible!
