Our SJF Eco Team members went through a selection process in which they shared their own personal 'manifestos', which was then followed by a vote. The new team met this week to discuss aspirations and goals for the coming academic year, which included continuing with the implementation of initiatives already started at school.

Important Reminder: The Pupil Premium Grant

If your family receives income-based benefits then your child(ren) might be entitled to receive a **Pupil Premium Grant** (PPG) which comes to school, and **free school meals** until they leave our school. The grant is also available to children who are in care and to any whose parents serve in the UK armed forces.



If you think that you are qualify please speak to us in confidence. It is important to claim the PPG even if your child is in [552] / [71] / [72] and receives the universal free school meals funded by the government for children in these classes and Mrs Ramsden can advise you about this too. Thank you.

Governorship

Last summer I explained that our Governors are key to supporting the ethos and strategic direction of our special school community, which is now as part of the St Clare Catholic Multi-Academy Trust. It is a time of extreme challenge for all schools because of historic funding issues and an overstretched citywide SEND provision. I asked you consider, seriously, stepping up for your school when the call came. Here is the call...

Why become a Parent Governor?

Governors have an important part to play in helping schools to run effectively. They work as part of a team with the Headteacher and school staff to help provide a happy, safe and thriving learning environment and an excellent education for all the children.

As a Parent Governor, you will understand parents' views and have first-hand knowledge of how the school is run. You will have the opportunity to work toward improving the school experience not only for your own child but for those in years to come.

This voluntary role can be challenging but it is extremely rewarding and is a great way to build on your personal and professional skills. You will be supported in the role through a programme of training and mentoring allowing you to use your knowledge and experience to the full extent.

What will you do?

You will work as part of the Local Academy Committee (LAC) to develop the school's vision and priorities, review educational performance, and make strategic decisions. You will receive reports from the senior leaders and will be expected to be able to question, challenge and/or support decisions.

Governor meetings are held nine times a year and you will also be encouraged to undertake school visits focused on school priorities or areas such as SEND, safeguarding and Health and Safety. Visiting the school as a governor can be a quite different experience to visiting as a parent.

Parent Governors are representative parents rather than representatives of parents. You will not be expected to gather the views of other parents and take them to Governors' meetings or to personally become involved in individual concerns. Instead, you will present a balanced and impartial view, based on the benefits for all children.

What are we looking for?

We need enthusiastic and committed parents from a variety of backgrounds. You do not need leadership or education experience; just a desire to give back to the school and its community and a proactive approach to becoming involved as a member of a team. We are seeking individuals from as many different backgrounds as possible to fully reflect the community the school serves; everyone has something to offer.






Our 'statement to live by' next week will be: "I can say one good thing about myself"
