Y4 RE CURRICULUM OVERVIEW | TERM 6 | 2024-2025



Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

The children will explore this term's theme 'Dialogue and encounter' through their different class topics.

"For in him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:28)

In this branch, pupils will learn how Christians work together with people of different religious convictions and all people of goodwill towards the common good, respecting the dignity of all humanity. They will also encounter other pathways of belief drawing on the teaching of the Church about intercultural dialogue.

TERM 6 Y4 | THEME: Dialogue and Encounter

Dialogue

As the children will learn about the life and mission of St Paul they will explore the following Bible texts:

- The Road to Damascus Acts 9:3-9, 17-19
- The first letter to the Corinthians 1:13:1-7,13 and 2:11:22-23
- Paul's speech before the Council of the Areopagus Acts 17:22-26, 28-29
- Galatians 1:11-24 and 3:27-28

By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know that there are different traditions linked to the Liturgy of the Church. They will also know some simple facts about different liturgical traditions in the Church, for example, some prayers or artistic traditions that reflect a community in their local area as well as some of the ways in which Christians work together for the common good in their communities and beyond.

Encounter

By the end of this unit of study, pupils will have encountered and be able to recognise the links and simple connections between some Jewish religious laws, beliefs, acts of worship and life in general. For example, keeping the Sabbath day holy and understanding how the Sabbath is celebrated in the synagogue and in Jewish homes. The children will learn to recognise that most Jewish religious words are in Hebrew (the original language of the Torah and other sacred Jewish/Christian texts). They will also learn about the experiences of others from different faith communities in their class and the local area.
