### **HOMEWORK**

- spellings for a weekly spelling quiz each week (please work hard on these to meet new standards)
- cross-curricular theme-related homework at various other times

### Spelling, Punctuation, Grammar & Handwriting

All children benefit from having regular handwriting, spelling, grammar and punctuation practise focused on meeting individual needs. Children all have individual targets for writing which will remain a focus in all writing.

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- ✓ practising how to punctuate pieces of text using full stops, commas, quotation marks and apostrophes
- ✓ testing your child on their weekly spelling list

### Reciprocal reading

All children will have daily access to reading resources and three times each week will be completing reciprocal reading which will help to improve their confidence, enjoyment and develop comprehension skills.

The **crucial knowledge** children must gain is knowing how to:

- ✓ edit sentences to include increasingly specific noun and verb choice.
- ✓ use dialogue to convey character and advance action in narratives
- ✓ use a range of sentence structures, (including omitted relative pronoun clause, colon/semicolon sentences)
- ✓ write complex sentences with implied (omitted) relative pronouns.
- ✓ spell at least 75% of words from the Y5/Y6 spelling list, correctly

You can support your child's learning at home by:

- √ reading with your child daily and encouraging them to read a wider range of more challenging books
- √ discussing their personal targets for reading (as shared on their record sheet from parent's meeting)

### **MATHEMATICS**

This term in mathematics we will be consolidating our mathematical learning since September, ensuring that children are familiar and competent in the use of various arithmetical methods, as well as with concepts relating to fractions, ratio, statistics, measure and more.

- use long and short multiplication appropriately and with increasing ease
- ✓ use long and short division appropriately and with increasing ease
- ✓ effectively interpret data that has been represented on a graph or chart
- ✓ measure, calculate and draw angles with increasing ease
- ✓ apply knowledge of decimals, percentages and fractions to solve problems

You can support your child's learning at home by:

✓ completing weekly homework and elping your child to work through their CGP revision guide

### MUSIC

The children will focus on performance, particularly within a group. This shall tie into our end-of-year Leavers' mass, which will involve a range of performances, much of which has been informed by our music study.

### **DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY**

This term we shall be studying how to design and build a range of structures. We shall explore how to shape and build various frames, paying close attention to how strong each given structure is.

The focus will be the Amazon rainforest. The children will explore its human and physical geography, its location within South America and the world, as well as the various sustainability implications relating to the region.

### SCIENCE

The children will undertake a unit of science learning which focuses on the study of Charles Darwin's theory of evolution and we shall look in detail at the process of natural selection, which underpins the theory. Moreover, we shall explore the evidence for Darwin's theory, including that of the fossil record.

### The **crucial knowledge** children must have is that:

- ✓ living things have changed over tie via a process of evolution.
- ✓ natural selection is the idea that individual traits that help a living thing to survive are more likely to be passed down to the next generation
- ✓ the fossil record provides evidence for the theory of evolution, as it shows that organisms from the past were very different from modern organisms

You can support your child's learning at home by researching the life and work of Charles Darwin.


