SJF RELIGIOUS EDUCATION









The children will explore this term's theme 'Creation and covenant' through their different class topics.

'The heavens are telling the glory of God' (Ps 19:1).

In this branch, pupils will encounter the God who creates and calls a people. They will explore revelation of the Christian belief that all that is comes from God, the Creation accounts in Genesis, and scientific explanations of the process of Creation. They will explore the call of God and his covenantal relationship with his people first through Abraham and Moses, then through the narrative of the Old Testament.

TERM 1 THEME: Creation and Covenant

Hear

By the end of this unit of study, pupils will have explored key Bible texts, including:

- the story of Noah, focusing on God's promise with Noah and all living beings in the sign of the rainbow (Gen 9:7-17).145
- 'Through Noah, who remained innocent and just, God decided to open a path of salvation. In this
 way he gave humanity the chance of a new beginning. All it takes is one good person to restore
 hope!' LS 71
- Psalm 139146 in praise of God's Creation of each of us and his love for us.

Believe

By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know that the Church teaches that:

- God makes a covenant (promise) with Noah to save all living things
- people in the story of Noah turned from God and chose to act badly, and this is behaviour called sin
- in the Sacrament of Baptism a person becomes part of the Christian family, promising to love God
- the Christian Bible is split into two parts, 'The Old Testament', and 'The New Testament'

Celebrate

By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know that:

- psalms are prayers to praise God
- sacraments are living signs of Jesus' love for all people
- baptism is the first sacrament which welcomes people into the Christian family

Live

By the end of this unit of study, pupils will know:

- ways in which they can show care for God's world (stewardship) as part of our care for each other
- how a baby is baptised in the Catholic Church.
