



Why Mouse Club?

Makaton

Makaton is regularly used in mainstream schools, to support all children to develop communication, language, and literacy skills. It also supports integration, as children with and without language difficulties can communicate with each other, learn, and play together more easily. This approach can also help people who are learning English as an additional language (EAL), helping them to communicate straightaway, while also supporting their learning.


