In our Tuesday assemblies, the children continue to reflect on **simplicity**, an important virtue that helps us to focus on what is important, to stay close to God.





Jewellery Reminder

The wearing of jewellery, including earrings/studs is **not** allowed. Appropriate watches can be worn, but not smart watches that enable children to get online.

Shoes Reminder

Children are expected to wear **proper school shoes** in school. Trainers (including allblack ones) must **not** be worn instead of school shoes. Children <u>can</u> bring any trainers to wear at breaktimes for playing football for example, but must have school shoes to change back in to afterwards. Trainers <u>can</u> be worn on PE days as part of PE uniform.





Children must wear the correct SJF PE uniform on PE days. If not bought from one of our official suppliers, then items must be in the correct SJF colours (burgundy sweatshirt and mid grey bottoms). They must be **completely plain** and **not** branded or decorated at all.
