

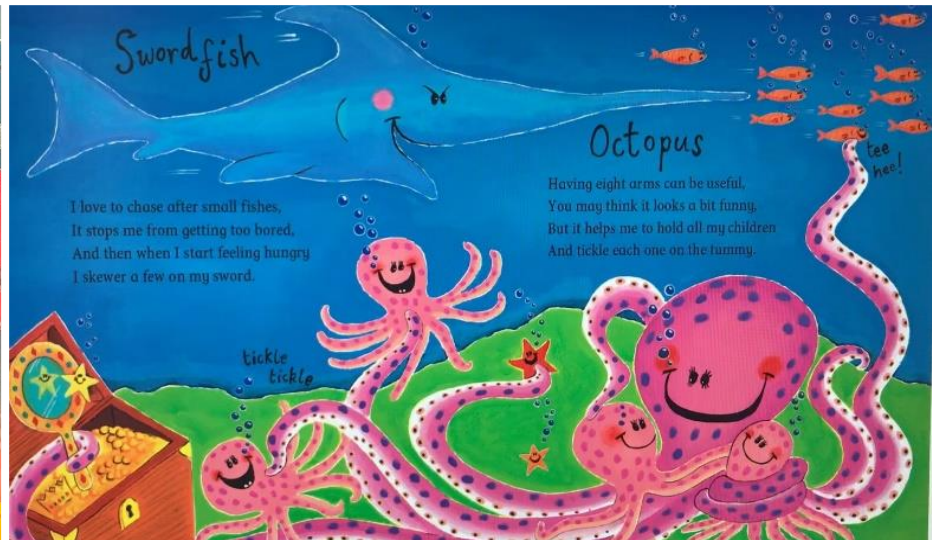
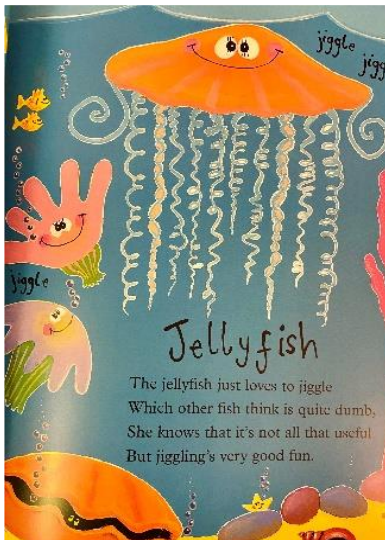

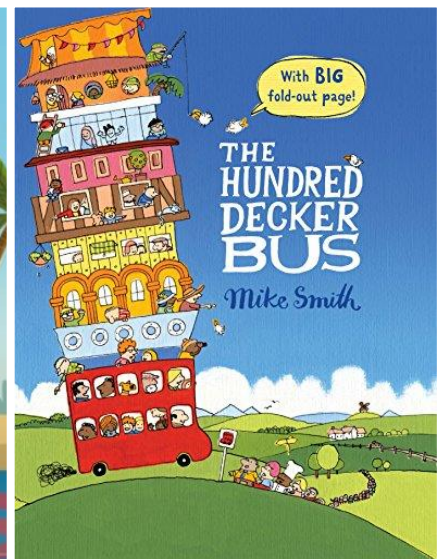


## Our Books of the Week

We are also learning the Makaton signs for the song: Down There Under the Sea. Please click [here](#). Please have a go together.

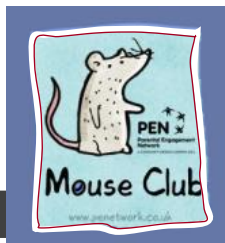


Down There Under the Sea



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## Ideas to try at home

- Listen out for rhyming words in the poems (remind your child that these words have the same sound at the **end** of the word, for example, funny and tummy, bored and sword).
- Can you find your own words that rhyme with the following words? **Shark** (dark), **sea** (tea), **fish** (dish), **shell** (well), **rock** (sock), **boat** (goat), **sand** (hand) **and wave** (cave).
- Play I Spy with the illustrations in the book - e.g. I Spy an animal beginning with 'o' (please use the letter **sound** – o for octopus) or play I Spy using description, e.g., 'an animal with a flat body, it looks like it has wings...'
- We have been learning how to break words apart into syllables – can they clap and count the number of syllables in the names of the different creatures? E.g., **crab** – one syllable, **dolphin** – two syllables, **octopus** – 3 syllables.
- Have a look at more sea animals on this film (below) discuss their appearance, if they are well camouflaged, how they move and maybe find out more facts using information books or the internet.
