



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Mouse Club at Home



- The most important way to support your child is to spend time together free from phones, devices and the TV and chat as you do things:
- making a den with blankets, or towels and chairs, or a cardboard box
- ✓ have a picnic in the garden, or in your den or a tent
- ✓ set up a mini sports circuit in the garden
 - jumping
 - potato and spoon race
 - obstacle course
 - run like a spider or a crab, etc.
- play schools with toys and teddies
- ✓ do chalk drawing on the ground outside (it washes away easily)
- ✓ visit the local library and join in activities there and bring home lovely books to share

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A walk round the local area or to a local park is a great way to burn energy and get fresh air but you could also play 'I Spy' or look for things of the same **colour** (e.g. something red ... a car, a coat, etc.) or something beginning with a **letter sound** of the alphabet (e.g. something beginning with 'b' ... a bus, bush, bin, bike, berries, etc.)

Please remember to play the game using the letter **sound**, just like we do in phonics. You could also do a **shape** or **number search** – what number can you spot on a house, a car, bus or tram, for example.

- A short journey on a tram, bus or train will be fun experiences if you chat and look at what you see on the journey, let your child help to pay for the tickets and look at what you see on the route you take.
- A trip to the shops can be full of learning opportunities and many supermarkets have free meals for children during the holidays:
 - plan a shopping list together, let your child write their own list
 - plan to cook or bake together, or plan a picnic and make a list of the ingredients or food that you will need
 - if you have to go by car talk about where you will park
 - in the shop let your child look for items or count them out together
 - stop and look at the different fruit and vegetables, maybe each week try one new fruit
- Cooking and baking are always popular and provide reading, science and maths experiences.
- Remember we expect the children to tidy up at school so include them with the clearing away and washing up, remembering to reinforce safety with hot surfaces/sharp objects.
- ✓ Going to the swimming pool or starting swimming lessons is fun, and important too.
- If you go further away plan ahead to see what discount tickets are available and let your child plan what snacks and food to take, then they can enjoy a home-made lunch and spend their money on a trip to the ice cream van.
