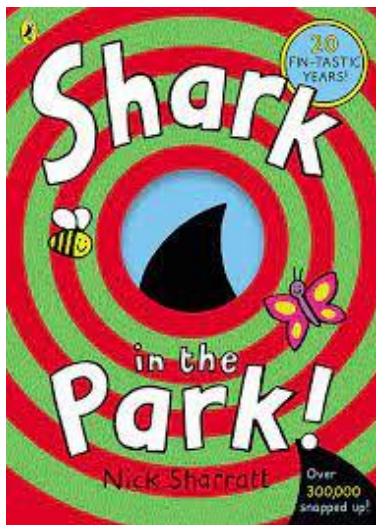

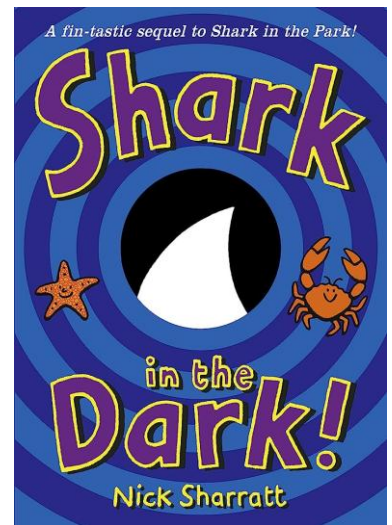


Our Books of the Week

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Activities to Try at Home

- Listen to both the stories being read aloud. As you listen, join in with some of the words and phrases. Ask your child what their favourite part of the story is and why? Do they prefer one of the two books?
- Make a telescope and ask your child to pretend they are Timothy Pope. Can they retell the story to their mouse or to someone at home?
- Can they look around the house with their telescope and write down what they find? e.g. hat, box, step, dog, bed etc.
- If the children have visited the seaside, please show them photos to remind them of their trip. Talk about how you all travelled there and describe what it was like. What did you all do and what did you see?

Index finger moves in appropriate direction.



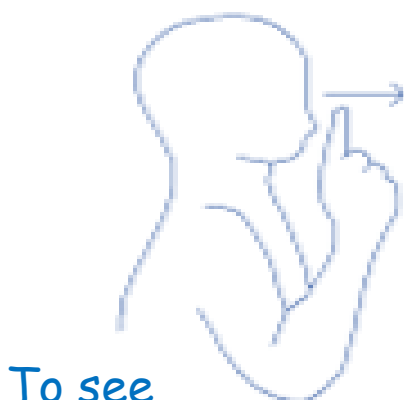
Boy
