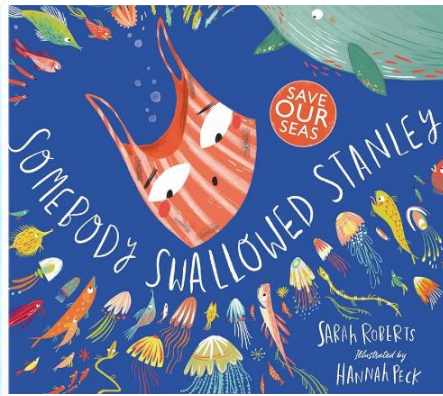

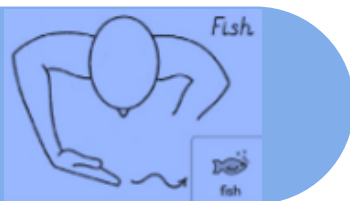


## Song of the Week is '**Ocean Jam**'
