On Tuesday Mr Jamie Kilner, a retired HMI and serving lead Ofsted inspector did a review of school on behalf of the Diocese as part of a programme of reviews of all schools in the Diocese of Hallam. It was very positive and builds on the outcomes of last May's Ofsted inspection. He was very impressed with the quality of writing and also pleased with the steps we are taking to address the Ofsted targets identified in the report around raising standards of writing. He also complimented us on the work we are doing to continually improve the physical environment and facilities – the classrooms, toilets, roof and was impressed with our plans going forward. He was really pleased with how the standard of children's work is improving. He was also really impressed by the children's fantastic learning behaviours consistently evident in every class throughout school, and by their good manners. He felt that relationships in our community were really strong and there were high expectations stemming from a real unity of purpose. Finally he remarked positively on the incredible journey we have been on over the last three to three and a half years.
