
Aims

Inclusion

If our aim is for every child to fulfil his/her potential then provision should be made to support those pupils who have additional barriers to overcome on their personal journeys with us. Obstacles can come in many forms and at any time; whether they be academic, emotional, behavioural, social, cognitive or physical and we have to be viailant and ready to act swiftly to address them.

Our approach is to first understand the need and its impact before working with parents/carers and multiagency partners to develop a personalised strategy that will support the child to overcome or come to terms with his/her situation.

All children have an equal right to succeed so our inclusion strategy is all about empowering the most vulnerable so that they too can reach their full potential. It is about developing and embedding, at an early stage, those positive attitudes and behaviours that will enable them make academic progress and ultimately to lead independent, happy, successful and fulfilling lives.

Curriculum

The aim of our curriculum is to develop inquisitive and independent learners who are happy and successful. In order to ensure that our young people are positive about learning the curriculum needs to be rich, broad and connected. Our young people need to be excited by the curriculum because they learn and achieve best when they are having fun and can see how it all fits together.

Broad whole-school cross-curricular 'Themes' provide a common 'root' to ensure that learning is joined up. There is also a sharp and constant focus on developing key skills in reading, writing and mathematics both discretely and within each theme. Every opportunity is taken for learners to use and apply them in a context that matters to them.

Curriculum Overviews are shared at the beginning of each of the six terms and parents/ carers are invited to get involved. RE is a core subject and cornerstone of our curriculum. Specialists support the learning of music and PE throughout the school and French from Year 3.





Partnership

We recognise that parents and carers are the first educators of their children and as such we understand that we play an important supporting role. We therefore invite parents and carers to engage with school life and become our full partners.
