

What your child's learning will look like:

Weekly maths learning – a series of slides and activities for each day

Weekly phonics learning – Daily activities at word level, phonics and sentence writing

Weekly PSHE – a discussion-based activity

Topic learning – a grid of activities to support the learning theme of the week



If you have more than one child at home and have limited access to a computer, please remember all children have access to several paper-based resources to support learning:

- Topic knowledge organisers
- Maths booklets with number bonds and times tables
- Spelling booklets
- Phonic sound cards (if applicable)
- Your child's reading book



Our blended learning offer:

At Turves Green Primary School we are passionate about our children doing their very best.

Therefore, when children are off as a result of long-term illness or are self-isolating, we will ensure our children still have access to a broad and balanced curriculum whilst at home.

We will provide learning both online and as a paper copy as required, depending on need, for all children away from school.

We know that you will support us at home with this learning to ensure that your child is able to continue to access their learning alongside their peers.

We will provide learning in the following subjects: Maths, Phonics, Topic and Personal Social Health and Emotional education. We will not be providing lesson activities for PE but do encourage you to provide opportunities for your child/ren to have access to some physical activity. We will provide some general activity ideas for you to have a look at.

Learning will be uploaded to the Home Learning section of the school website weekly for the week ahead.

If your child is self-isolating, then this learning should be recorded in their Home Learning exercise book enclosed with this pack and can be shared with teachers at school via a photo sent via the Tapestry app.

If your child's class or year group bubble is isolating, then learning will be shared with you using the Tapestry app. Your child will be able to share their learning with Teachers using the app.



What do I do if my child is isolating?

A. My child is isolating and will be accessing their learning online.

1. Notify school	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Call us on 0121 464 3686
2. Accessing your child's online learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Click on the pink Home Learning tab on the school website. If your child's whole class or year group bubble is isolating then learning will be shared using the Tapestry app, use the log in details provided in the pack.
3. How will you receive learning?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Each week your child's class teacher will upload a pack of learning to the pink Home Learning section of the school website including reading, writing, maths and topic for your child to work through. If the whole bubble is isolating the learning will be shared on Tapestry.
4. How will you record learning?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use the exercise book provided by school. This is enclosed with your blended learning pack. If the whole bubble is isolating, your child can also record learning online using Tapestry.
5. How will you share learning with your child's class teacher?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> If your child has completed paper-based learning, you can take a photo of your child's learning and share it via the Tapestry app If the whole bubble is isolating your child's learning will be shared with teachers via the Tapestry app. They will look at this daily and will respond to learning.
6. What do I do if I am not sure what to do or if my child is finding it tricky?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Contact school either via email or by telephone. A member of staff will offer support. This may not be your child's class teacher. We will carry out a welfare call weekly to make sure all is well but do not hesitate to contact us sooner if your child is finding it tricky and needs some help.

What do I do if my child is isolating?

B. My child is isolating and will be accessing their learning using paper-based resources.

1. Notify school	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Call us on 0121 464 3686. We can print off a paper-based copy of your child's learning.
2. How will you receive the learning?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Can a family friend collect a learning pack from school and deliver it to you safely? If not, please notify school to post this to you.
3. How will you record learning?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use the exercise book provided by school. Your child will bring this home at the first available opportunity. If you need more resources, please let us know.
4. How will you share learning with your child's class teacher?	Take a photo of your child's learning and share it via the tapestry app.
5. What do I do if I am not sure what to do or if my child is finding it tricky?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Contact school either via email or by telephone. A member of staff will offer support. This may not be your child's class teacher. We will carry out a welfare call weekly to make sure all is well but do not hesitate to contact us sooner if your child is finding it tricky and needs some help.
