## School Values - Responsibility

Following consultation with pupils, parents, staff and Governors, our school values were identified as Respect, Responsibility, Community and Resilience. These values guide everything we do and help our pupils grow not only as learners, but as people.

For the month of January, our focus value will be Responsibility. Responsibility means taking ownership of our actions, making positive choices and understanding how our behaviour affects ourselves and others. It is an essential life skill that prepares our pupils for the future and supports them in becoming the person they want to be.

Throughout January, our **\*\*Pupil of the Month\*\*** award will recognise pupils who consistently demonstrate responsibility both in school and when representing our school in the wider community. This includes behaviour on the way to and from school, on the bus, and during any school-related activities.

Responsibility can be shown in many ways, such as:

- \* Being prepared for school with the correct equipment (glue stick, pencil, homework diary and completed homework)
- \* Managing ourselves well by showing maturity and self-control
- \* Managing behaviour and emotions positively
- \* Representing our school with pride
- \* Being kind and showing care towards others
