When pupils attend without booking, club leaders cannot prepare appropriately, which can impact the quality and safety of the session. Accurate numbers also ensure that adequate supervision is in place; larger groups require more adults to maintain safe ratios and provide proper support for all children. By booking through the app, families help the school manage clubs efficiently, keep sessions safe, and ensure every child can fully benefit from the experience.
