


Autumn 2nd Half Term










What do animals and humans need to survive?





Please ensure that children have their full PE kit in school. This half term we shall be completing a dance topic therefore only a white top, dark coloured shorts and pumps are required.


Homework

Learning in Year One

Our Curriculum

In English the children will be focusing on writing words, captions and simple descriptions about themselves. They will also be describing signs of autumn and enjoying reading and retelling a variety of traditional tales.

In Phonics the children will consolidating Reception learning, for example, recognising sounds such as *ch, sh, th* and *ng;* reading and writing words containing these.

In Maths the children will be continuing to work on counting using numbers up to 100. They will also explore different ways of representing numbers using practical equipment and number lines. The children will begin to focus on 2d and 3d shapes, finding a half of a number, object or shape as well as using positional language to describe objects.

The children will also be learning the following subjects in our 'Who am I?' topic: Art, Computing, Design Technology, Geography, History, Music, PE, PSHE, RE and Science. Please see the Knowledge Organisers that follow which include the 'Big Questions' the children will be exploring and vocabulary that they will be using. It will be a great help to your child's learning and understanding if you can discuss and use some of these words at home, too.

Holly Hill's Christian values will continue to be at the heart of everything we do. This half term the

children will be learning about forgiveness, gentleness, joy, thankfulness, kindness, friendship and honesty.




