Children are encouraged to develop strong aspirations *educationally, socially, morally* and *spiritually* with a desire to make a positive difference in the world.



letting you know if your child is in a club for the next term. If your child is unable to attend the club please, can you inform the school office so that another child can attend in their place.








During this journey we will learn:

How can we express ourselves through dance?




During this journey we will learn:






