About half way!

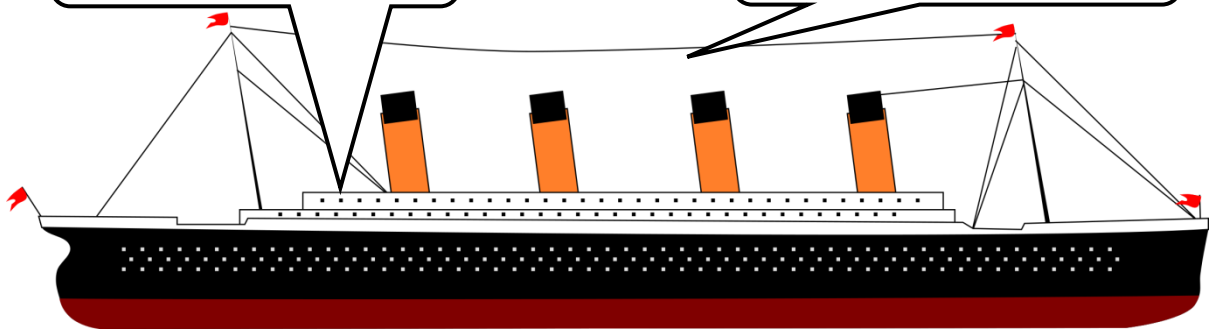


Cad é a fhaigheann tú má thrasnaíonn tú an tAigeán Atlantach leis an Titanic?
Thart fá leathbhealach!

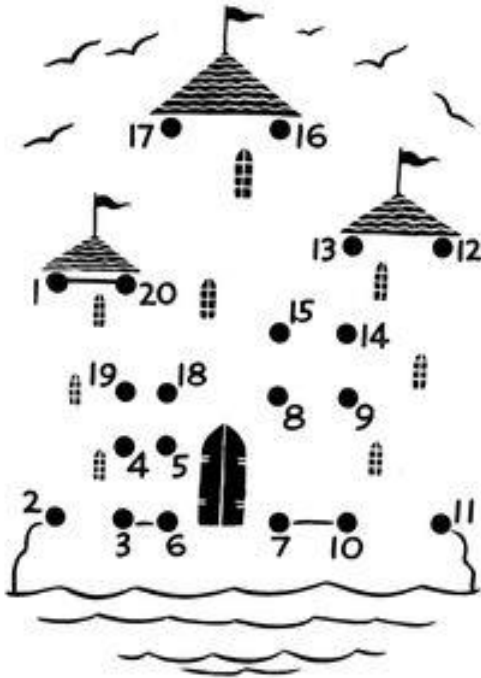

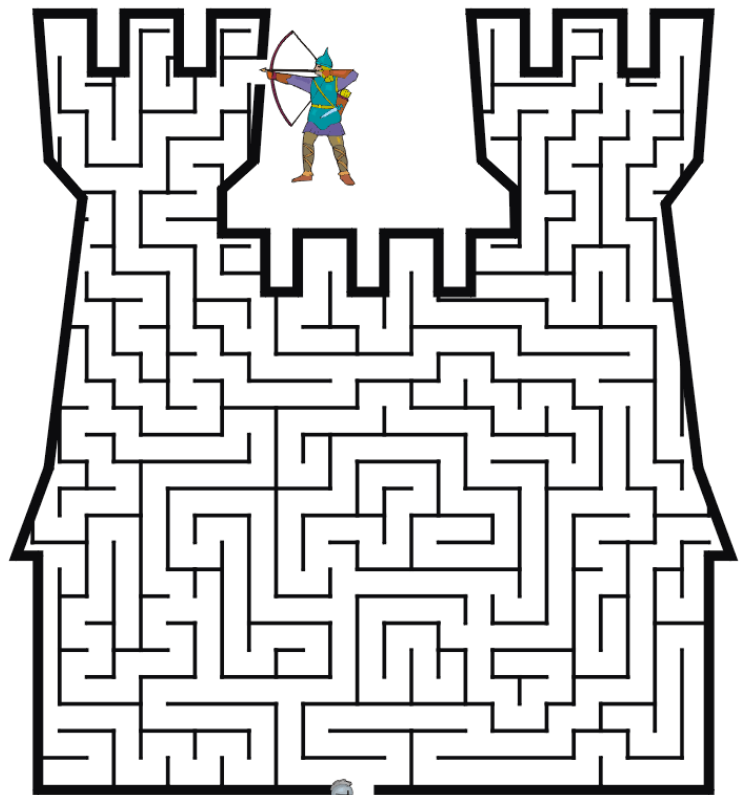

Club Teisteanna / Test Club



Le seacht mbliana anuas, cé go bhfuair gach dalta ar mian lena dtuismitheoirí áit láithreach i Scoil Iósaef, an Domhnach Mór, déanann mórlach suntasach Scrúdú Iontrála na Scoileanna Gramadaí. Ullmhaímid na daltaí don scrúdú i ndiaidh na scoile anois (dhá lá i Rang 6, ceithre lá i Rang 7) agus bíonn ár dtorthaí chomh hard is a bhíodh i gcónaí le breis agus 70% de Ghráid A agus B le trí bliana anuas.

Over the last seven years, while all pupils whose parents wish them to do so have transferred automatically to Scoil Iósaef, Donaghmore, quite a significant majority of pupils still sit the Grammar School Entrance Test. We are now preparing the children for the test after-school (two days in P6, four days in P7) and our results over the last few years have been as high as ever, with 70% of pupils gaining A and B grades.

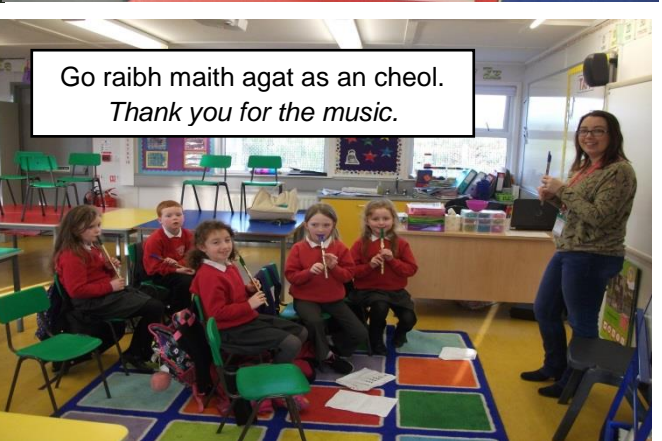
