How to Pray the rosary:

Starter Prayers: Our Father, 3 x Hail Mary, Glory be to the Father.

For each story, think about what was happening.

While you are thinking, pray Our Father, $10 \times \text{Hail Mary}$, Glory be to the Father.

The Joyful Mysteries

The Annunciation - when the Angel Gabriel told Mary she would have a baby boy and he would be called Jesus.

The Visitation - when Mary went to see Elizabeth to tell her the news. Elizabeth shared the news that she was also going to have a baby! This son would later be known as John the Baptist.

The Nativity - the great story of Christmas!

The presentation of the Lord Jesus in the temple - as a very young baby, Mary & Joseph brought Jesus to the temple. A wise man told them that he would bring great joy and great sadness.

The finding of Lord Jesus in the temple - At the age of 12 Jesus went missing. He was found talking to the wise men. When Mary said she was worried, Jesus said, "Did you not know I would be in my Father's house?"

EUERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS -

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

| 100% Attendance | 0 Days Missed | Excellent |
|-----------------|--|--------------|
| 95% Attendance | 9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed | Satisfactory |
| 90% Attendance | 19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed | Poor |
| 85% Attendance | 28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed | Very Poor |
| 80% Attendance | 38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed | Unacceptable |
| 75% Attendance | 46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed | Unacceptable |

For some parents, 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly 4 school weeks.
