Universal Infant FREE School Meals

All pupils in reception, year 1 and year 2 (infants) in state-funded schools are entitled to free school meals. Simply talk to your school, mentioning any special dietary needs. The menu will be on your school or academy's website, or you can visit nottinghamshire.gov.uk/schoolmeals



FREE school meals (pupil premium)

If you are the parent or carer of an infant or older child and you receive one of the qualifying benefits below, please register for free school meals. If you do, your child's school can claim extra funding (known as pupil premium) to help provide extra activities for yours and other children at the school. Pupil premium allows your child's school to invest more money into your child's education.

- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC)) that does not exceed **£16,190**
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Income-based and Contributions-based JSA and ESA on an equal basis
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after the person stops qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit – if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than **£7,400** a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).
