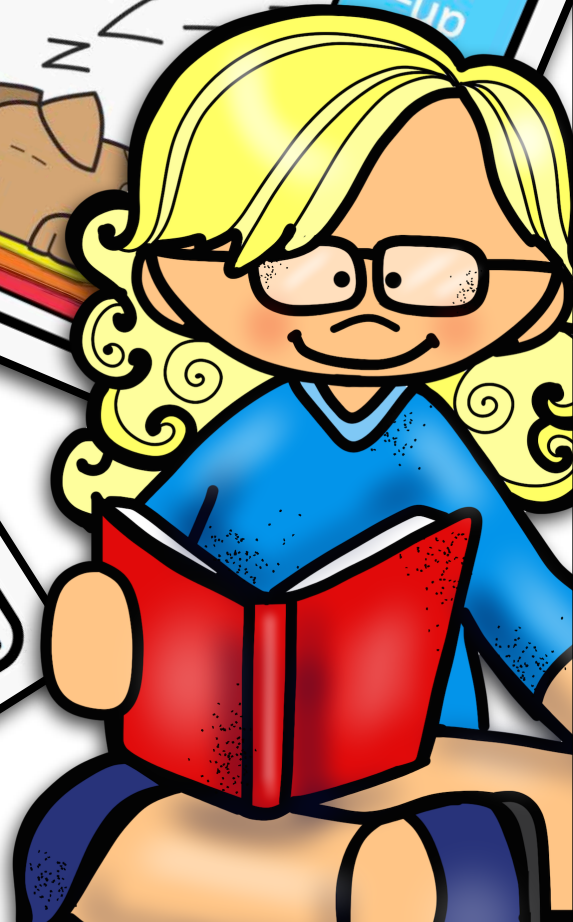

Guided Reading Books for Beginning Readers: Set 1

This set of 10 guided reading books will help your little readers feel successful! They are just right for beginning readers. Each book focuses on sight words and/or word families. The following word families are addressed: -al, -am, -an, -at, -en, -et, -id, -ig, -ip, -og, -ug, -un, and -up. This set of guided reading books also covers the following 42 sight words: am, and, I, the, has, in, is, see, did, no, not, yes, do, you, have, too, will, like, play, she, it, here, go, on, can, had, went, for, little, big, one, two, three, at, that, look, what, with, find, green, off, and of. Each book builds on the sight words and word families already learned. Character names are CVC or CVCC words. Repetitive text is included as practice for young readers.

This set of guided reading books addresses the following CCSS for kindergarten and first grade:

RF.K.1 Demonstrate understanding of the organization and basic features of print. Follow words from left to right, top to bottom, and page by page.

Understand that words are separated by spaces in print.

RF.1.1 Demonstrate understanding of the organization and basic features of print.

RF.K.2. Demonstrate understanding of spoken words, syllables, and sounds (phonemes). Isolate and pronounce the initial, medial vowel, and final sounds (phonemes) in three-phoneme (consonant-vowel-consonant, or CVC) words. (This does not include CVCs ending with /l/, /r/, or /x/.)

RF.1.2c Isolate and pronounce initial, medial vowel, and final sounds (phonemes) in spoken single-syllable words.

RF.K.3. Know and apply grade-level phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words. Read common high-frequency words by sight (e.g., the, of, to, you, she, my, is, are, do, does).

RF.1.3b Decode regularly spelled one-syllable words.

RF.K.4. Read emergent-reader texts with purpose and understanding.

RF.1.4 Read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension.

Very First Reading Comprehension Passages

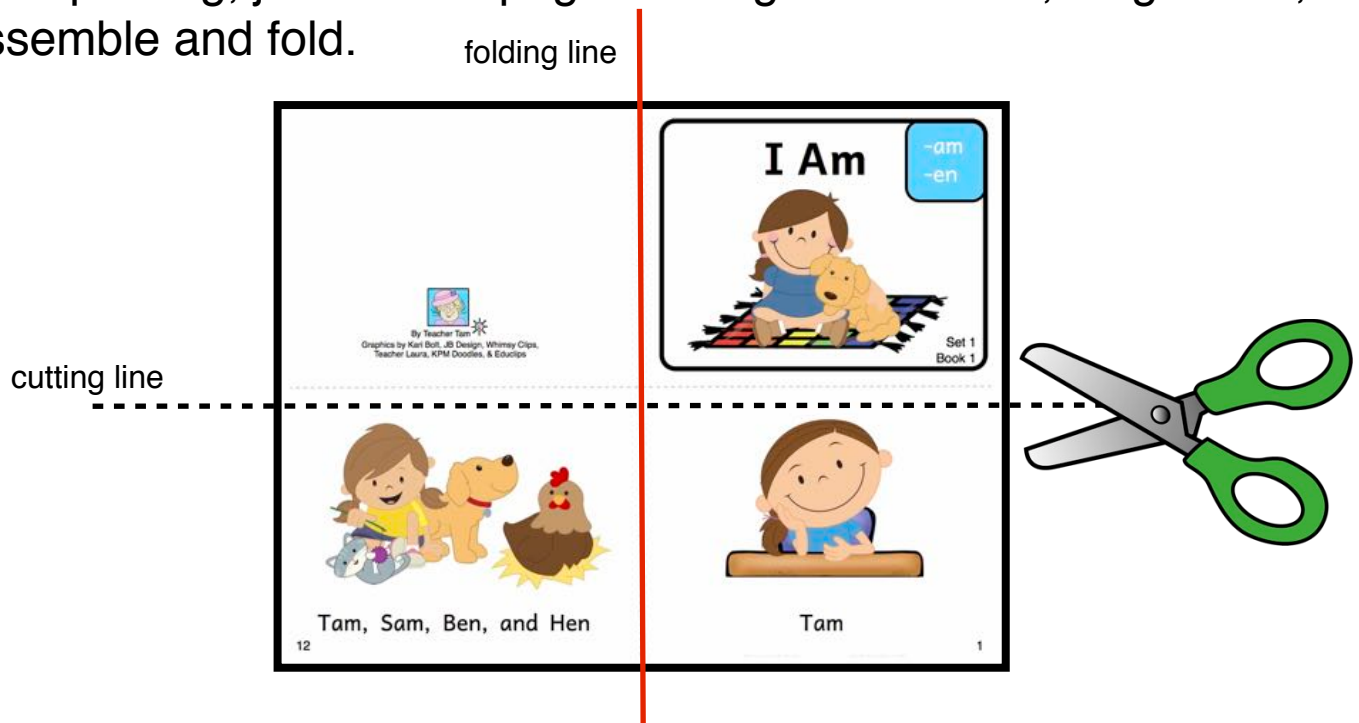
This reading comprehension set includes 50 passages for beginning readers. The passage on each page focuses on a short vowel word family. Each reading comprehension passage focuses on short vowel words and beginning sight words.

Printing Instructions

The books are made to print pages 1 & 3 back to back. Pages 2 & 4 also print back to back. That way, you can print the first 2 pages, then the last 2. *****IMPORTANT*****: Open the file with the latest version of Adobe Reader. Go to the “Print” page. Find “Page Size & Handling” on the “Print” page. Choose the option “Actual Size.” If you do not, then the fold lines will be a little off.

For the full-color classroom copies, I use a heavier weight of paper (50-70 lbs) than normal copy paper so the colors don't show through. I also laminate the outer page (front/back) with the thinnest laminating sheets that I can.

After printing, just cut the pages through the middle, lengthwise, assemble and fold.



Use a long reach stapler to staple the books on the center line. I have found that this helps the books fold better and keeps the staples from hiding text or pictures.

I hope your students enjoy reading the books!
