| Monday | Phonics: Rhyming words. | Sound out the words. Remind children of the 'sh', 'ch', 'ck' diagraphs. Draw a line to match/cut and stick to match or colour the same rhyming word in the same colour. eg: chip-ship blue deck-peck red | Place value - Tens and Ones (New concept). <br> YouTube video uploaded on home schooling page. | Numbers have a place value. <br> Numbers 0 to 9 are made up of ones and numbers 10-20 are made up of tens and ones. <br> E.g. number 5 is 5 ones Number 10 is made up of 10 ones but it is grouped as 1 ten. number 15 is 1 ten and 5 ones. <br> Introduce children to this language by watching the YouTube video before completing the activity. |
| Tuesday | Pirates: Label the parts of a pirate ship. | Label the pirate ship by writing the parts into the boxes. Children can write a sentence about a part of the pirate ship as an extension activity. | Place value - Tens and Ones | Continue to use the tens and ones terminology. I like to say that tens are tall and ones are small. |
| Wednesday | Pirates: Make a Pirate Menu | Children to write a list of food and drink for each meal using word mat. Children to write in list format. <br> Extension - draw a picture of one of their meals from the menu. | Time- Half Past | Revision of half past times. Remind children that when the big hand points to 6 it means half past. |
| Thursday | Phonics- Pirates word building. | Reinforcing sounds and diagraphs that we have covered in P2. <br> "ng", "ck", "ch" and "sh". <br> Children to cut out the picture and unscramble the sounds to correctly spell the topic word. | Place value - Tens and Ones | Reinforcing this new concept. |
| Friday | Design your own pirate flag. |  | Parent led Spelling <br> Test and <br> Numeracy/Maths target. | Test the children on the spellings and target set at the beginning of the week. |
