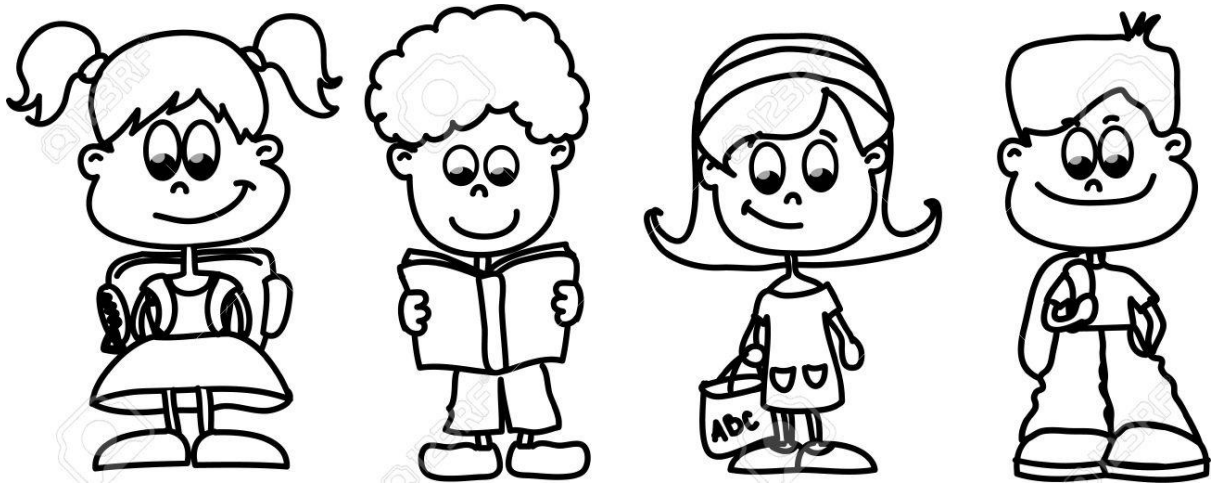

Monday	Pirate Party Invitation	Use the Pirate Party Word Mat to write an invitation to child's pirate party. Children colour in the correct number of tens and ones and write the number underneath.
Tuesday	If I were a Pirate...	Children to think about and write about what they would look like as a pirate, how they would act as a pirate, things they would do as a pirate. Use word mat to help. Wednesday	Phonics - Revising "sh" sound.	Cut and stick the pictures into words beginning with sh or ending with sh. Make Your Own Pirate Hat

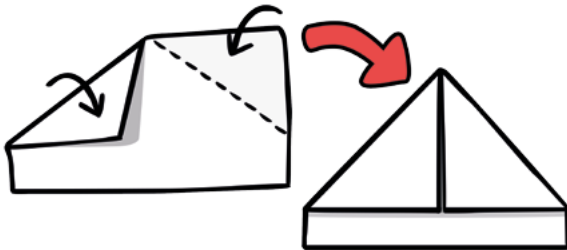
1 Use a large rectangular piece of paper or newspaper



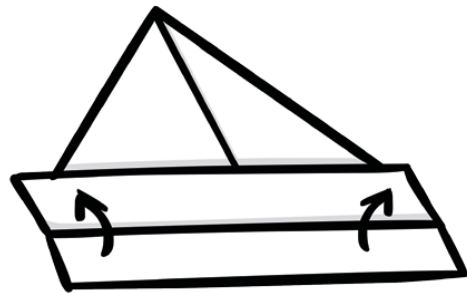
2 Fold the paper in half.



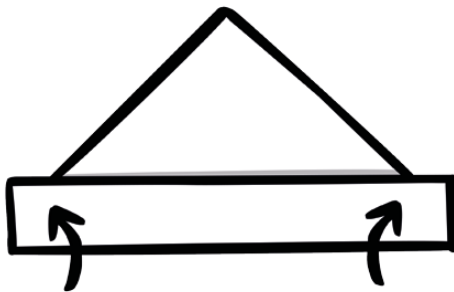
3 Fold over the top corners so they meet in the middle.
