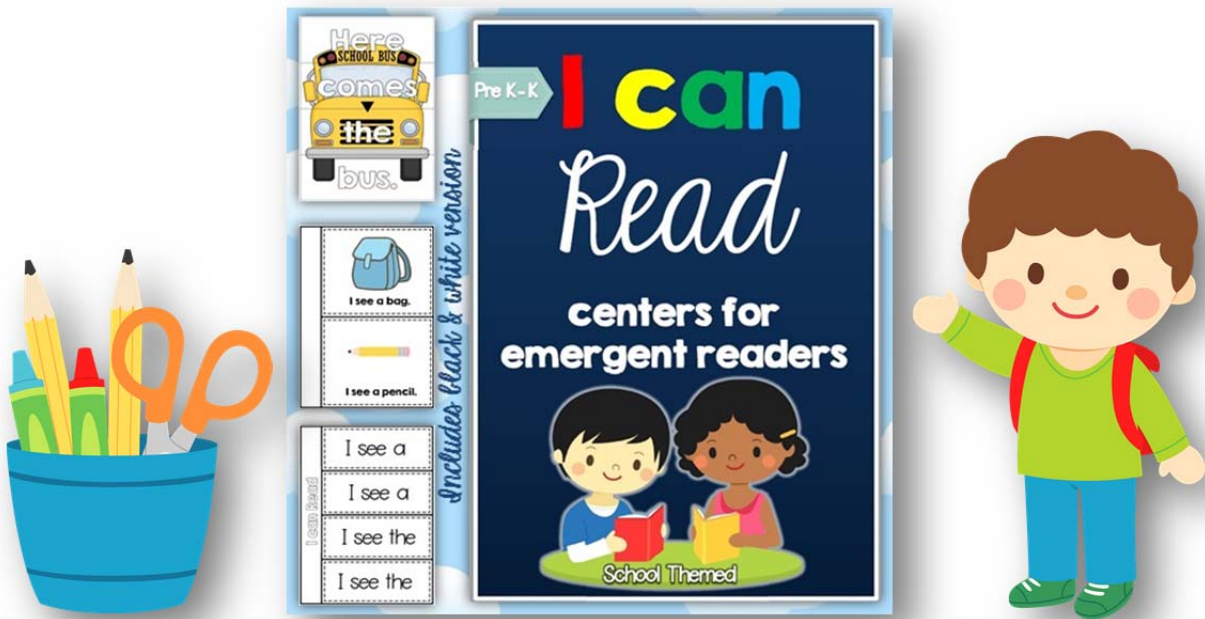

Basic Structures Displays

Purpose: Your displays aim to help children access known structures in a reading or writing context and overview the basic language structures that you are teaching your emergent readers.

How to: Print and laminate your structures. The structures should be displayed where students can access them. You may like to refer to the focus board headers in this file as these structures could also be displayed on your focus board.

Students could use these prompts during centers. Include the instruction pages and multiple copies of the laminated structures either cut up of four to a page, in a bag, folder or box for your students.

1. **Write and Wipe-** Children could use dry erase/whiteboard markers to complete each sentence by choosing words from the one page, vocabulary chart in this file or with any words seen around the room.

2. **Magnetic Sentences:** Have students use magnetic letters to complete the sentences.
