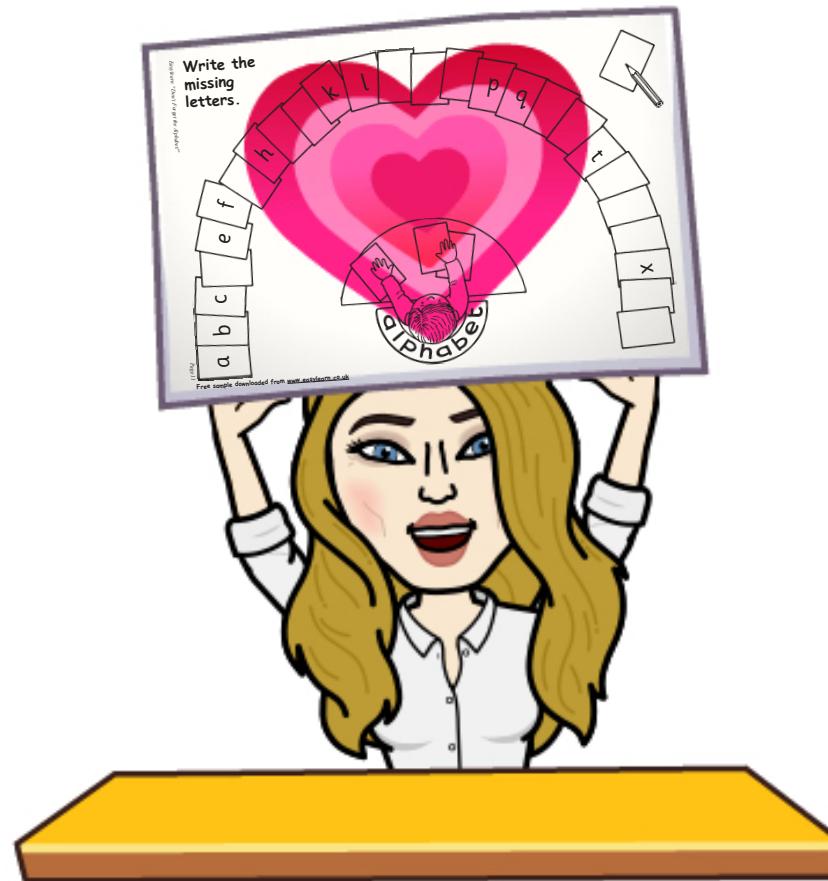


# When do I use capital letters?

This is fun.

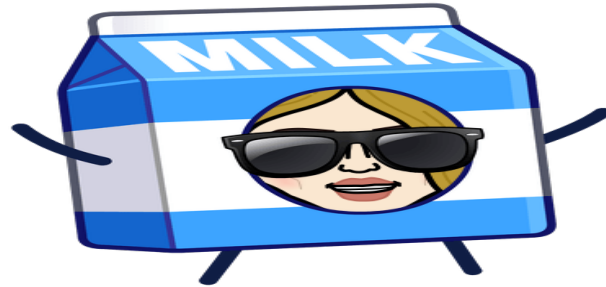


The word I is always a capital letter.

I like milk.

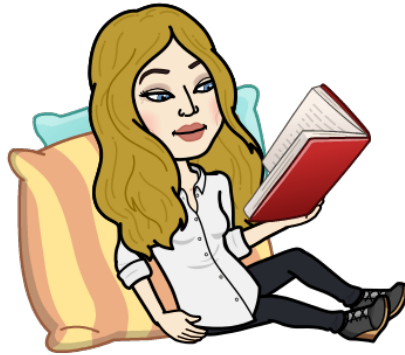


I can run.
