How a Parent can make a complaint

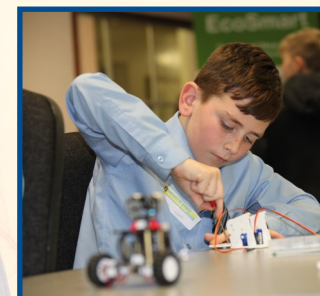
- I can talk to the Form Tutor;

Parents can:

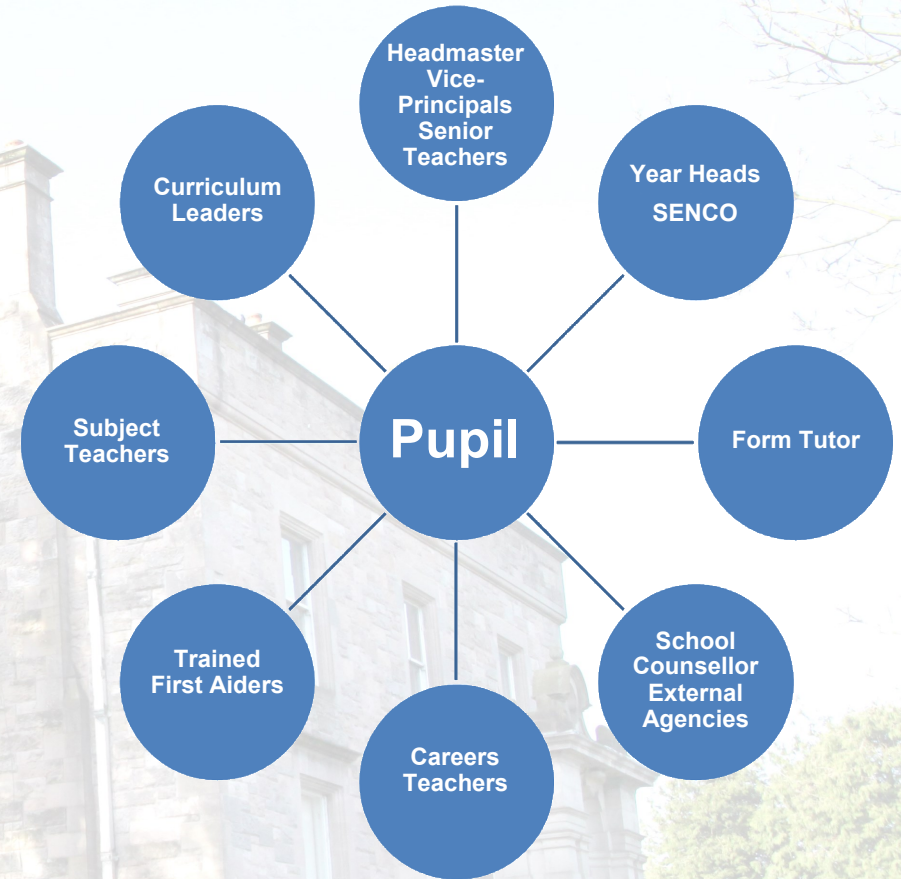
- Watch for signs of distress or unusual behaviour in your child;
