Tuesday 25th May the death of Fr Brian O'Donnell was a sad day for St Brigid's Primary School. Fr O'Donnell (as he was affectionately known, was a stalwart supporter of the school, who campaigned tirelessly to improve our accommodation and resources. He was a regular visitor to the school where his personality and quick wit were evident. Pupils formed a guard of honour outside the Church at his funeral, and whilst his remains were being taken to the grave Key Stage 2 pupils and staff lined out in O'Donnell Park (named after Fr O'Donnell) as a mark of respect for this gentle, loyal priest. Maghera Heritage Centre:

Maghera Heritage Association have had 1:50 scale models made of local heritage sites - Knockoneill Court Tomb, Tamneyrankin Court Tomb and Tirnoney Portal Tomb. These were displayed in our Assembly Hall on Tuesday 8th June, with information banners, so that the children could learn about Stone Age life in our local area. The models were very high quality and the information provided was very informative. Each class had an opportunity to visit the exhibition and learn about ancient construction and burial practices.

The models proved an excellent stimulus for World Around Us lessons in this primary school. Their use enabled the teaching of abstract historical concepts through these concrete materials, which ensured that learning was deepened. The models are an attractive and beneficial teaching and learning resource for primary pupils. A number of our families have already visited the heritage sites at Tirnoney, Knockoneill and Tamneyrankin due to the interest expressed by their children.



P7 Visit to Stormont

On Wednesday 25th November the then Education Minister, Peter Weir visited our school as we tried to convince him that we needed a new school. I hardly need to tell you what happened next. He said NO to a new school, but he did have his photograph taken next to a P7 portrait of him. Suddenly some P7 artwork went viral and after lots of publicity at that time, we were invited to Stormont by the Finance Minister, Conor Murphy; the visit was delayed due to Coronavirus and took place on Tuesday. These very talented P7 children were great ambassadors for our community. They talked to the politicians with great pride about the excellent facilities up at the Club. They asked about support for farmers' post-pandemic. They asked about the support for working class families, they wanted to know about the easing of restrictions. MLAs said that their questions were better than those asked by many journalists!

The pupils took part in a Stormont Woodland Trail, led by Estate staff. They enjoyed a picnic lunch in the warm sunshine then enjoyed the excellent facilities of the Mo Mowlam Play Park. They zip-lined and climbed and swung and run - so much excitement! Then they were met by six Executive Ministers - First Minister Mr Paul Given, Deputy First Minister Michelle O'Neill, Finance Minister Conor Murphy, Agriculture Minister Edwin Poots, Education Minister Michelle McIlveen and Minister for Infrastructure Nichola Mallon. Every conversation was captured by a barrage of reporters and cameras - it was like a red-carpet press frenzy!

After the Press Call, pupils were treated to an ice-cream or ice-lolly before returning home.

The Stormont Communications Team commended **ALL** of these children, they had never before experienced such well-behaved, well-informed children. Every family should be so proud of these well-adjusted, thoughtful and articulate young people.
