New ASC1 Unit

We were very fortunate that in September we opened our Autism Specific Class. With the support of the Education Authority, a mobile classroom was renovated – new floors, doors, double-glazed windows and complete painting and redecoration. We were also part funded to set up a Sensory Room adjacent to our ASC.

In order to avail of an Autism Specific Class, a child must have a “statement” from an Educational Psychologist. Our ASC is for children from P1 – P4 and we currently have four pupils enrolled, P1, P2 and two P4s all of whom are boys.

The teacher in ASC1 is Miss Faoiltiarna Burke and the assistant is Mrs Susie Kuczogi, both of whom are specialists in working with children who have Autism. The ASC is proving to be an excellent asset to our school.




This term all Key stage 2 classes have been introduced to mindfulness through the 12 session programme Paws B. Mindfulness has been proven to offer benefits for emotional wellbeing, mental health, the ability to learn and physical health. In order to sustain and champion daily mindfulness practice, children have been appointed as Mindfulness Ambassadors. Presently they are very skilled at leading their peers in a range of practices. There are also plans afoot for them to share their expertise beyond the classroom to the whole school community in terms two and three.



These children have already shown dedication and commitment to their role. They completed a 4-week afterschool training programme alongside study on google classroom. They were delighted to be presented with their Ambassador badges by Mrs O’Kane and it is hoped they will wear them with great pride.

School Census:



On the 8th October the annual DE school census took place. In St. Brigid's we had 253 pupils, 122 boys and 131 girls. 11 pupils had a Statement of Educational Needs.

Neuronimo Lessons

Neuronimo is a mental and physical health programme designed to target resilience, manage impulse control, sleep and mood. It shows our children how to calm their anxieties. The children have been learning all about how their brains work and each day in class they practise their “Bursts of Brilliance.” In St Brigid's we have funded these lessons as part of our Recovery Curriculum.



New School Councillors:

Our School Council consists of pupils from P4 to P7 who have been elected to represent their class. School elections are held in June and a new School Council is elected each school year. Involving pupils in real issues through class and school councils helps them to develop important life skills that promotes positive mental health and social welfare. From P1 each class holds a class meeting monthly and the issues raised from these meetings are sent to School Council. This can range from asking for new equipment in the playgrounds to raising money for a charity. School Council have organised numerous activities and experiences for the whole school community – including Coffee Mornings, surveying parents and pupils to ascertain their views, adding to the school uniform with the introduction of a half-zip and creating Easter Trails to name but a few. School Council have played an integral role in improving the experiences in the school for all the pupils. Our school councillors make a positive contribution to the school environment and school ethos.

On the 12th October 2021 we are delighted to have a newly elected School Council. We have councillors from P4, P5, P6, P7A and P7B. These children have been voted by their peers to represent their class. School Council meet with Mrs Mc Crum and Mrs O Kane each month. They discuss the issues and suggestions generated from their monthly class council meetings. Congratulations to the new School Councillors! We wish them every success in this special position and look forward to having their help to improve school experiences for all the children of St. Brigid's.

Project 1 is designed to enhance ICT skills through STEM activities. The project will provide opportunities for integrated learning, hands on discovery and adaptations to ensure lessons will reach all students and their ability levels.

Project 2 is aimed to open the minds of pupils in Primary Schools to the joy of entrepreneurship. The project will provide pupils with a set of skills that they will need to enhance their future employability. Pupils will be encouraged to own and run their own mini-business.

Due to the ongoing Covid restrictions travel to our partner schools may not be possible, but we continue to meet virtually. The children enjoy their partnership projects and the opportunity to see life in European schools – they are amazed that they are the only school who wears a uniform! Schools in the UK can no longer participate in Erasmus+ due to Brexit so we are making the most of this while it lasts.

Maths Week Ireland!

Monday 18th October began Maths Week Ireland in St. Brigid’s we promoting positive attitudes towards Maths this week as we joined with over 395,000 pupils taking part in Maths Week Ireland. Our theme this year was Exploring Maths in the Jungle. Each class completed a jungle themed competition and had some fun working with their teachers and class groups to develop problem solving skills. Pupils also got to play maths games and to solve puzzles to test their skills. This year, for the first time all classes also used Maths Week TV and enjoyed the different presenters who shared their Maths lessons across the whole of Ireland.

As part of the events of the Maths Week Ireland Keystage 2 classes watched a live lesson about magic in Maths.
