Term 2 Takes off:

Friendship Fours Ice-hockey Tournament

On the 5th January, our Primary 6 and Primary 7 pupils enjoyed an Ice Hockey match at the SSE Arena in Belfast. The game was part of the Friendship Series 2024 and our children were so fortunate to attend. For many, today was their first time at such an event, and it was wonderful to see such happy faces!

The high-profile tournament, organised by The Odyssey Trust, brings two top North American women's college ice hockey teams — Princeton University and Providence College — together for an action-packed double-header at the home of the Belfast Giants.

The Friendship Series is the first and only NCAA Division 1 women's hockey tournament to be held outside of the United States. The event is an extension of the Friendship Four tournament, which was devised by The Odyssey Trust in 2015, and has been developed year on year to promote education, social welfare, and community integration in Northern Ireland, building on the sister cities agreement between Belfast and Boston.

Miss McAlister and eight P6 pupils attended the Digital Leaders training St Mary's Primary School Glenview on Wednesday 10th January.


Service of Light and Enrolment Ceremony
































Love for Life Talk


Break the Rules Day

The day started with a special assembly which was led by our newly appointed Principal and Vice Principal for the day, Master Conway and Miss Ward. Master Conway and Miss Ward were then treated to a cup of tea made by Mrs McEldowney, before beginning their duties for the day. To begin, it was straight to business as Master Conway and Miss Ward met with our school Trustee Fr. E. Graham PP to discuss the planned extension for our school. Master Conway expressed his concerns and explained that the government had no money to do the job! It was then time for a meeting with Sacristan, Mr Tom Magill who cuts the grass and looks after O'Donnell Park. The Way of the Cross

Primary 7 pupils from St Brigid's PS performed the very moving 'Mary's Way of the Cross' in two local churches during Holy Week. 'Mary's Way of the Cross' tells the story of the Stations of the Cross from Mary's viewpoint - as a mother watching her Son suffer and die. Simeon told Mary at the beginning of Jesus' life "a sword of sorrow will pierce your heart" and this dramatic story really enables the congregation to think about suffering and loss from a relative's perspective.

On Palm Sunday their first performance of 'Mary's Way of the Cross' was in St Mary's Church, Craigavole. The children told the passion story through drama and song with their emotional rendition including Daniel Boyle as Jesus carrying his cross, whilst wearing a crown of thorns. The role of Mary, superbly played by Caoimhe Murtagh, had the congregation enthralled. These young children re-enacted the story showing their considerable talents in music and drama. The school choir added so much to the performance with a selection of Taizé chants and hymns.

On Spy Wednesday they performed in their own parish church — Our Lady of Mercy, Lavey. Parish Priest and School Trustee, Fr Eamon Graham commended the children on their telling of the passion and death of Jesus from this moving perspective of Mary. He added that the pupils had created a very polished and professional performance which delivered a strong Easter message to all.






Shared Education


