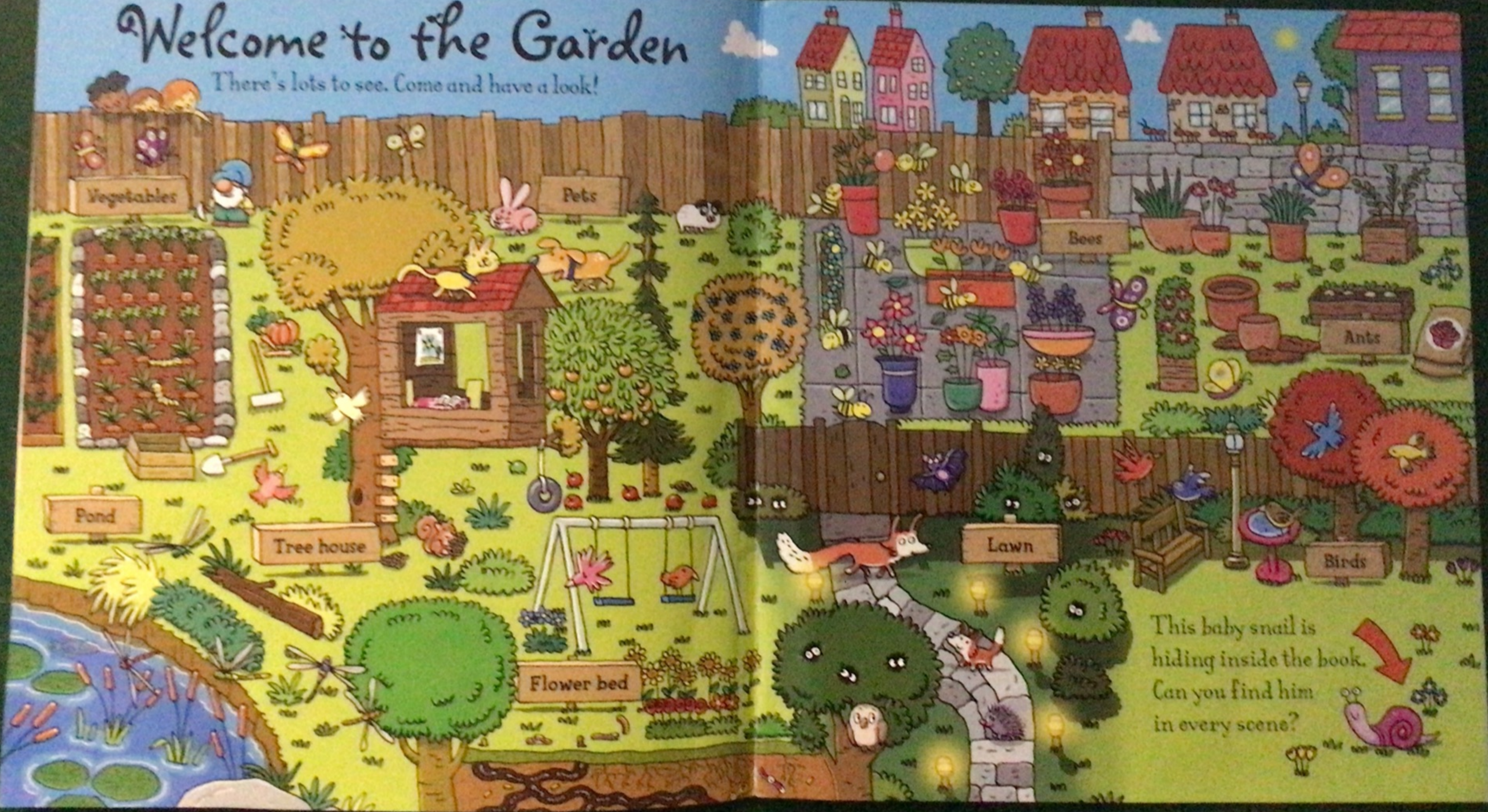

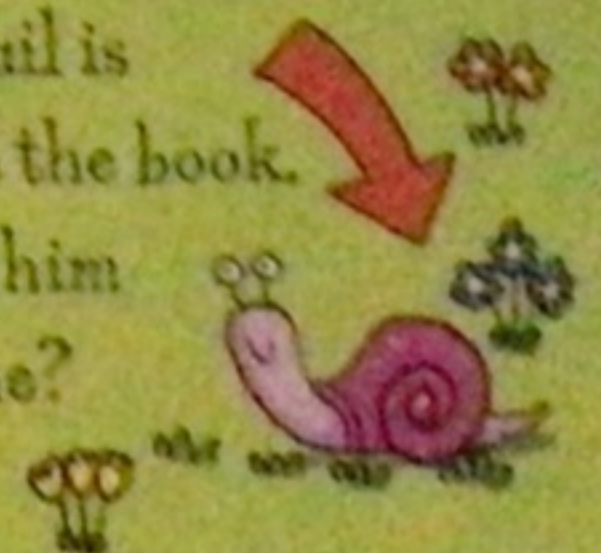




Worms do a very important job. They bring air and food into the earth so that plants can grow.

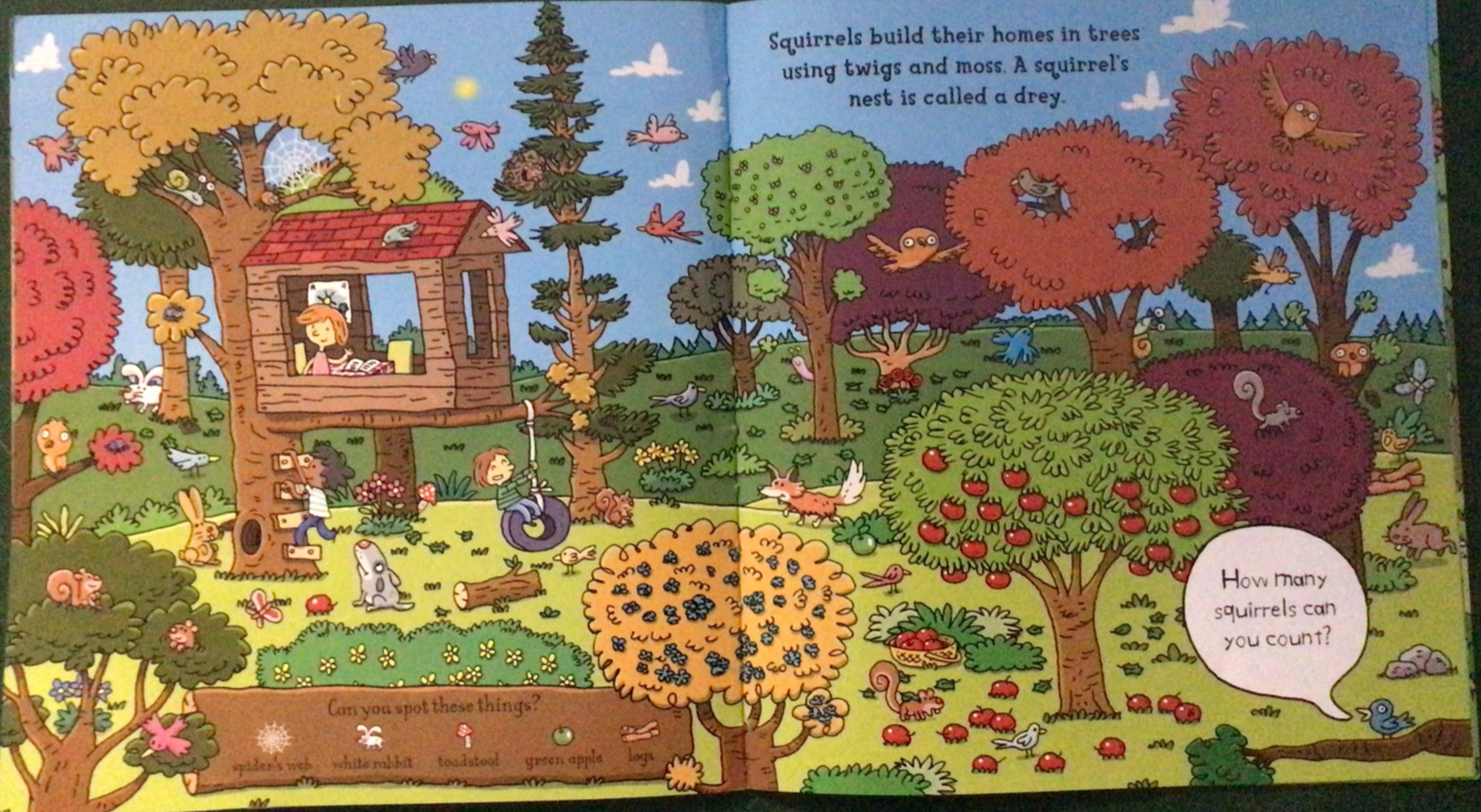
Which sunflower is the tallest?

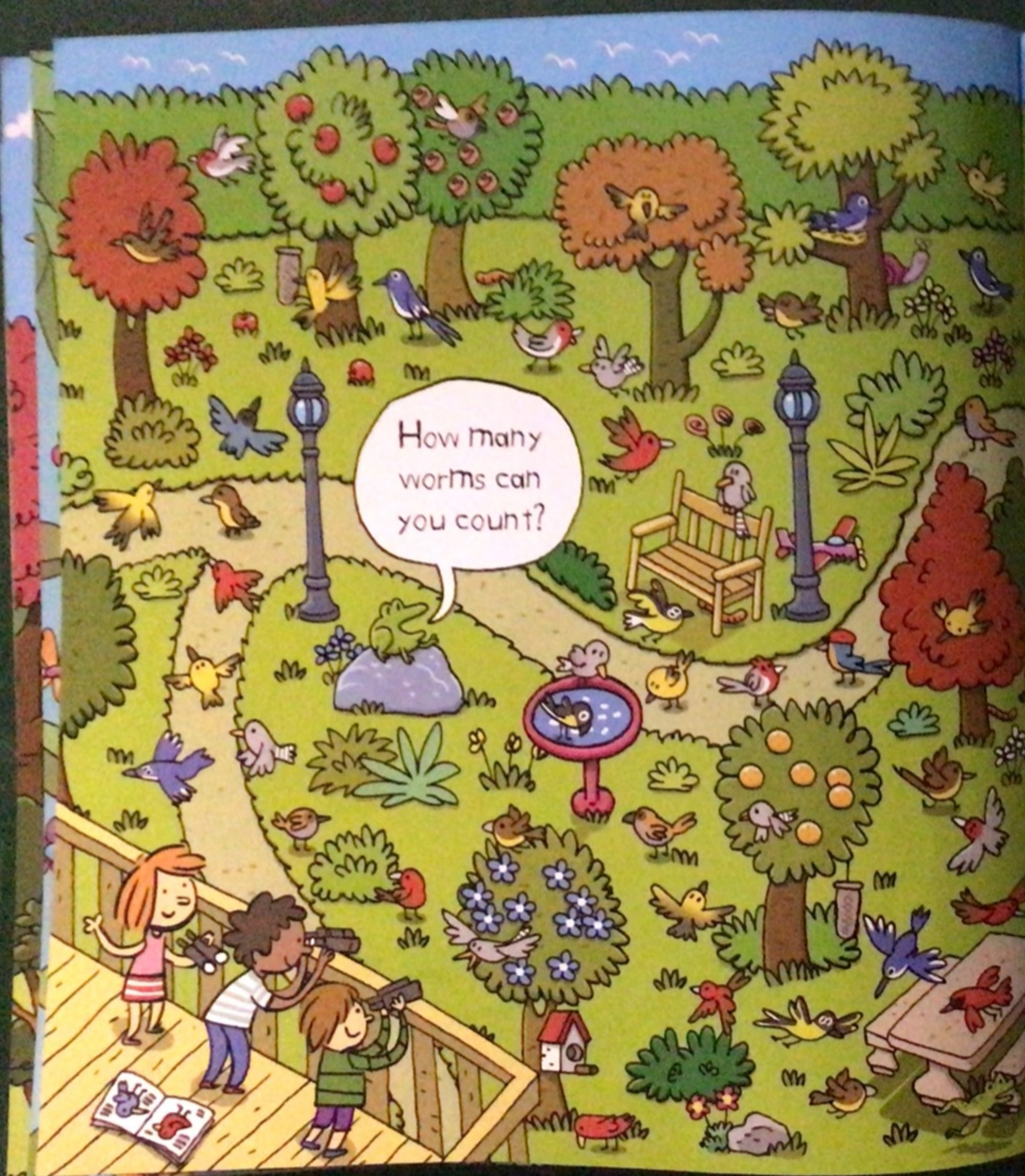

Bees do a special dance to tell each other where the best flowers are.

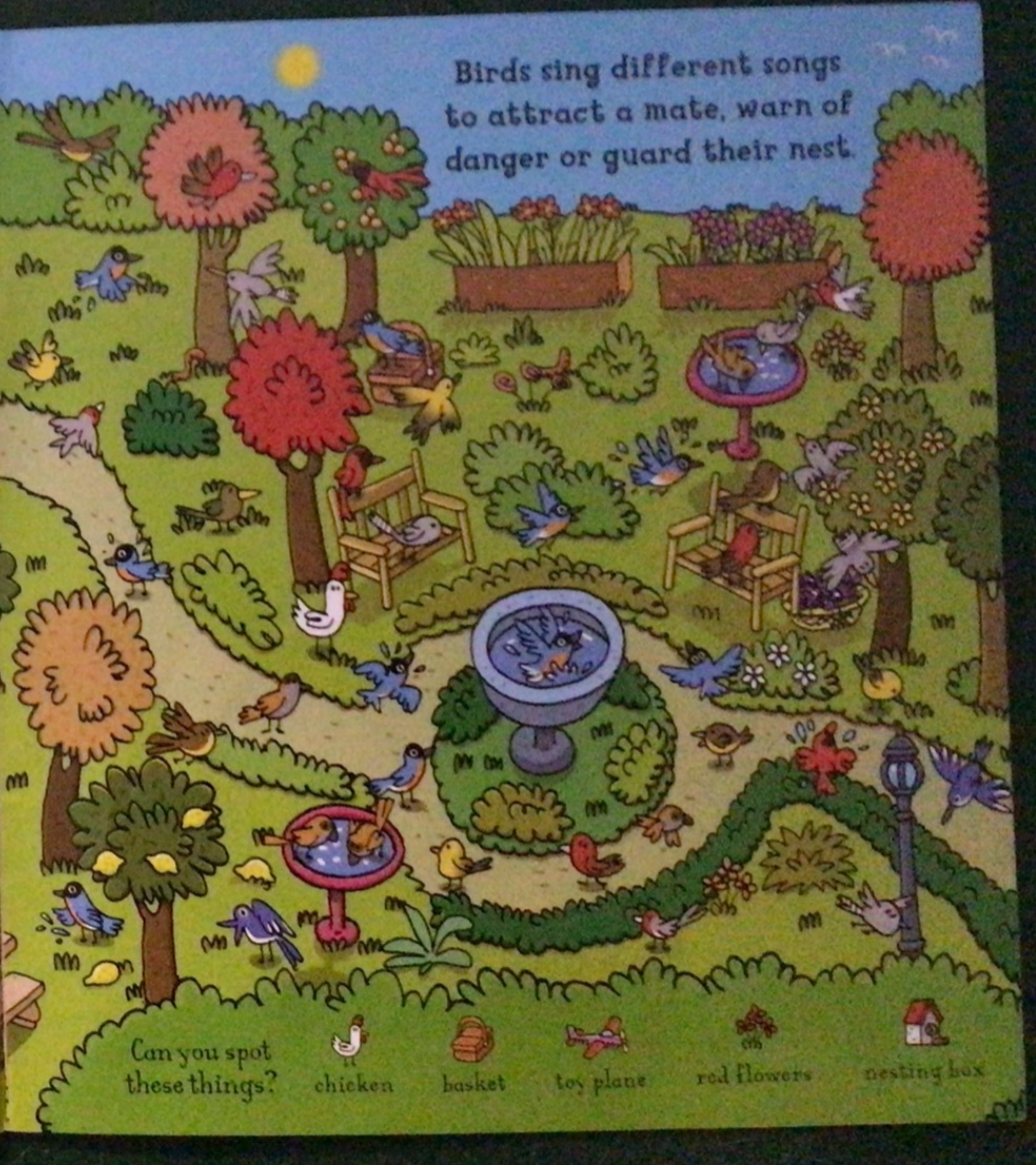

Did you know?

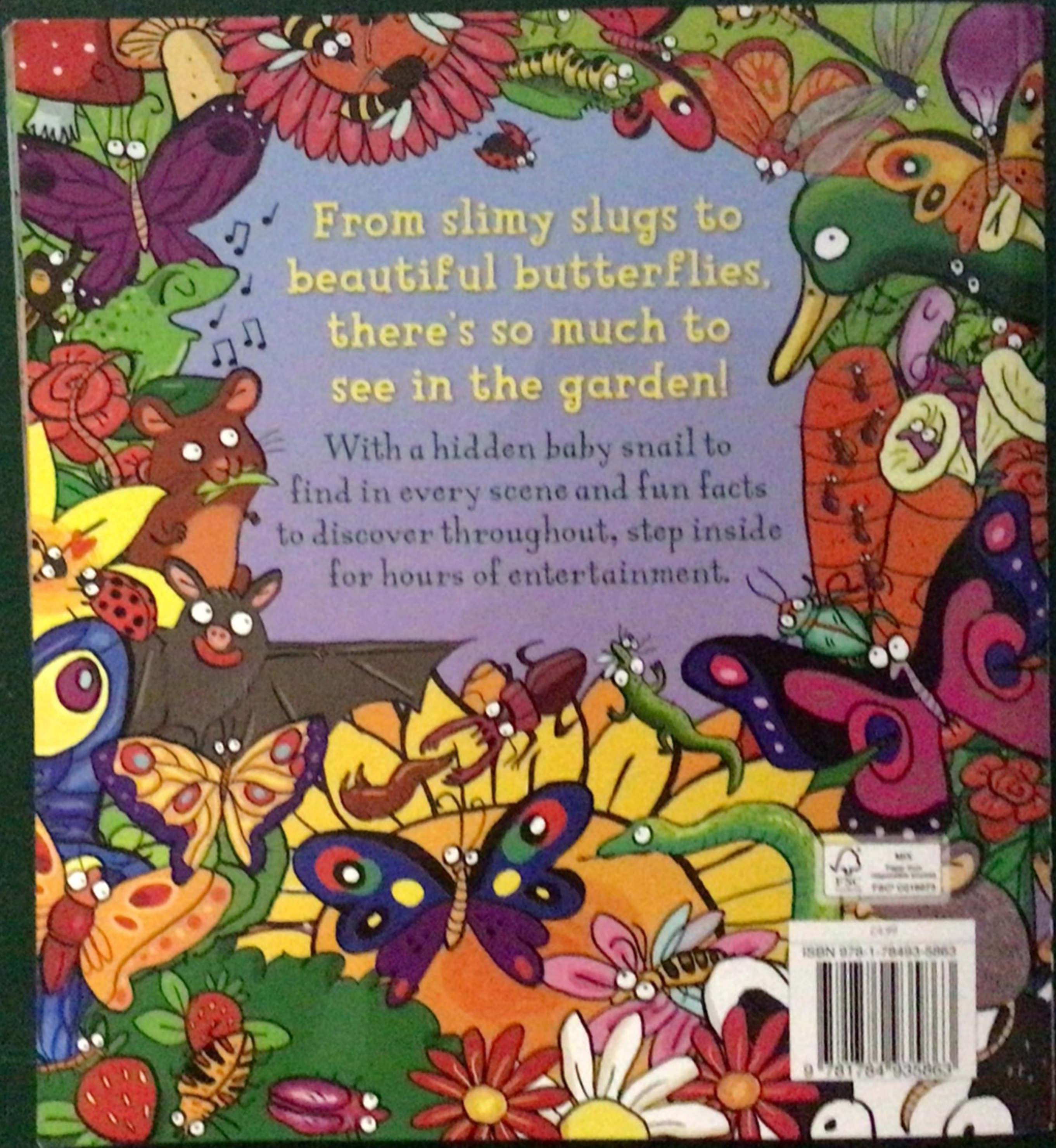
Grasshoppers and crickets are great at jumping. Some can jump 50 times the length of their body in one big leap.
