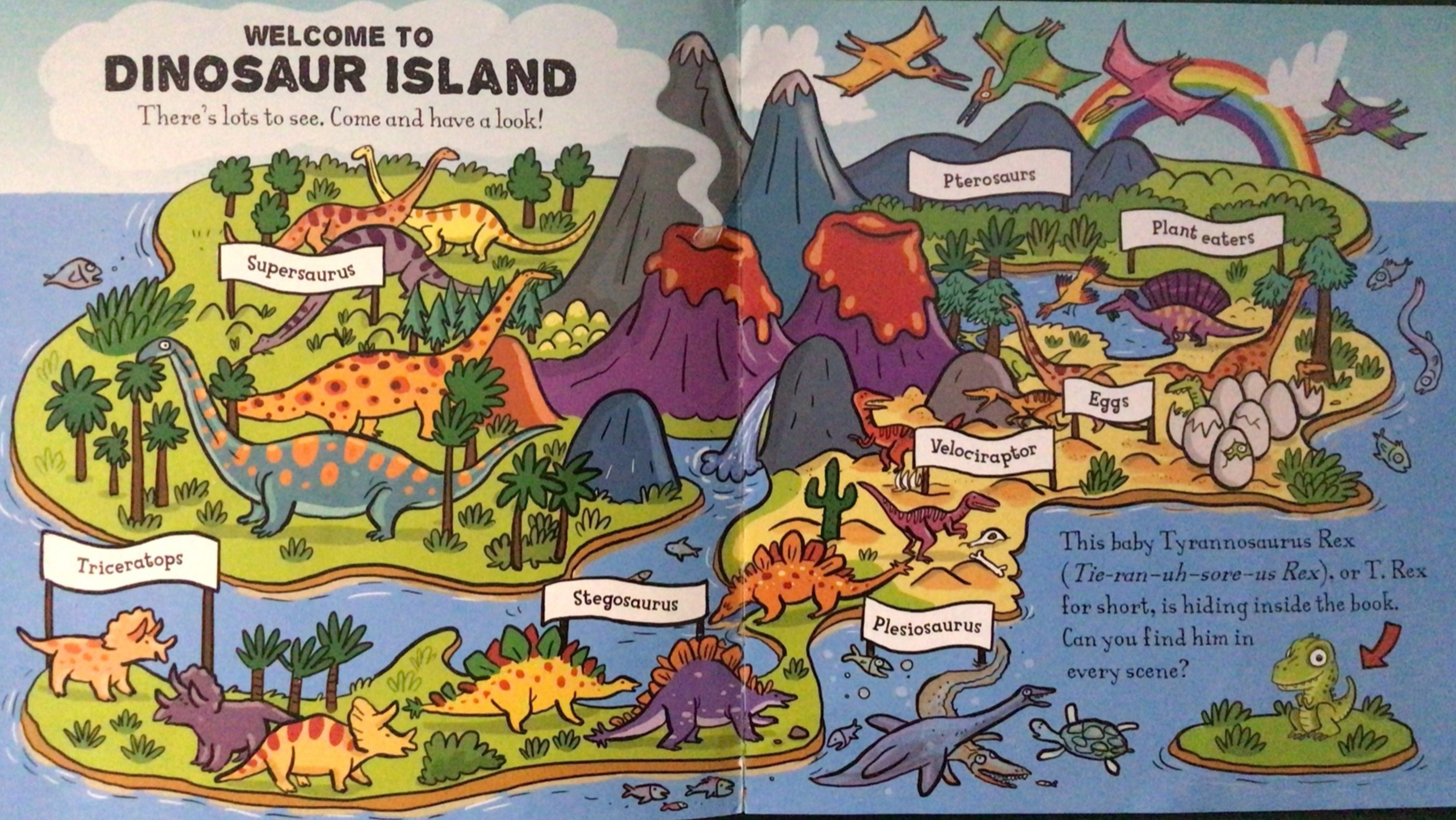


WELCOME TO DINOSAUR ISLAND

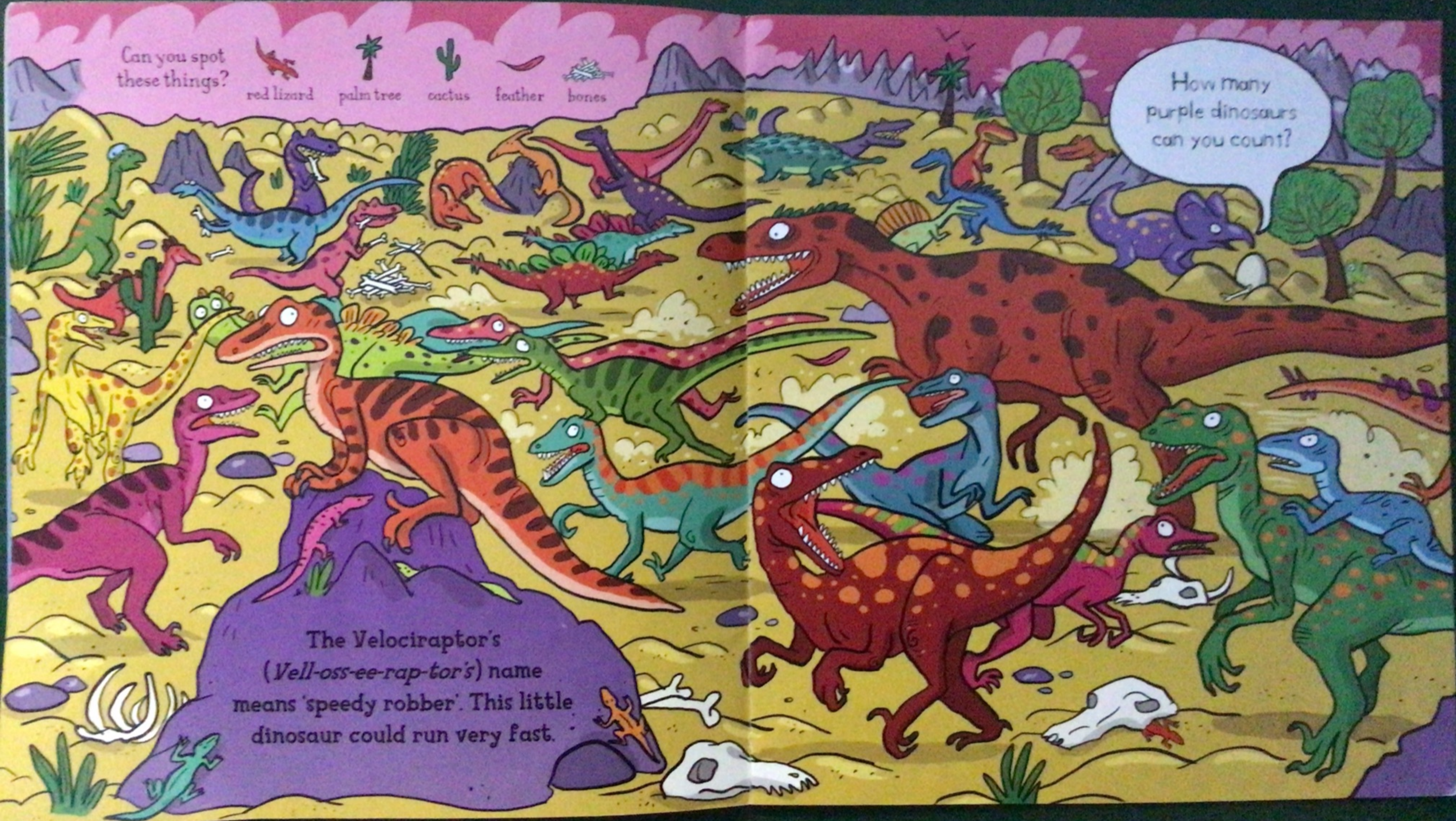





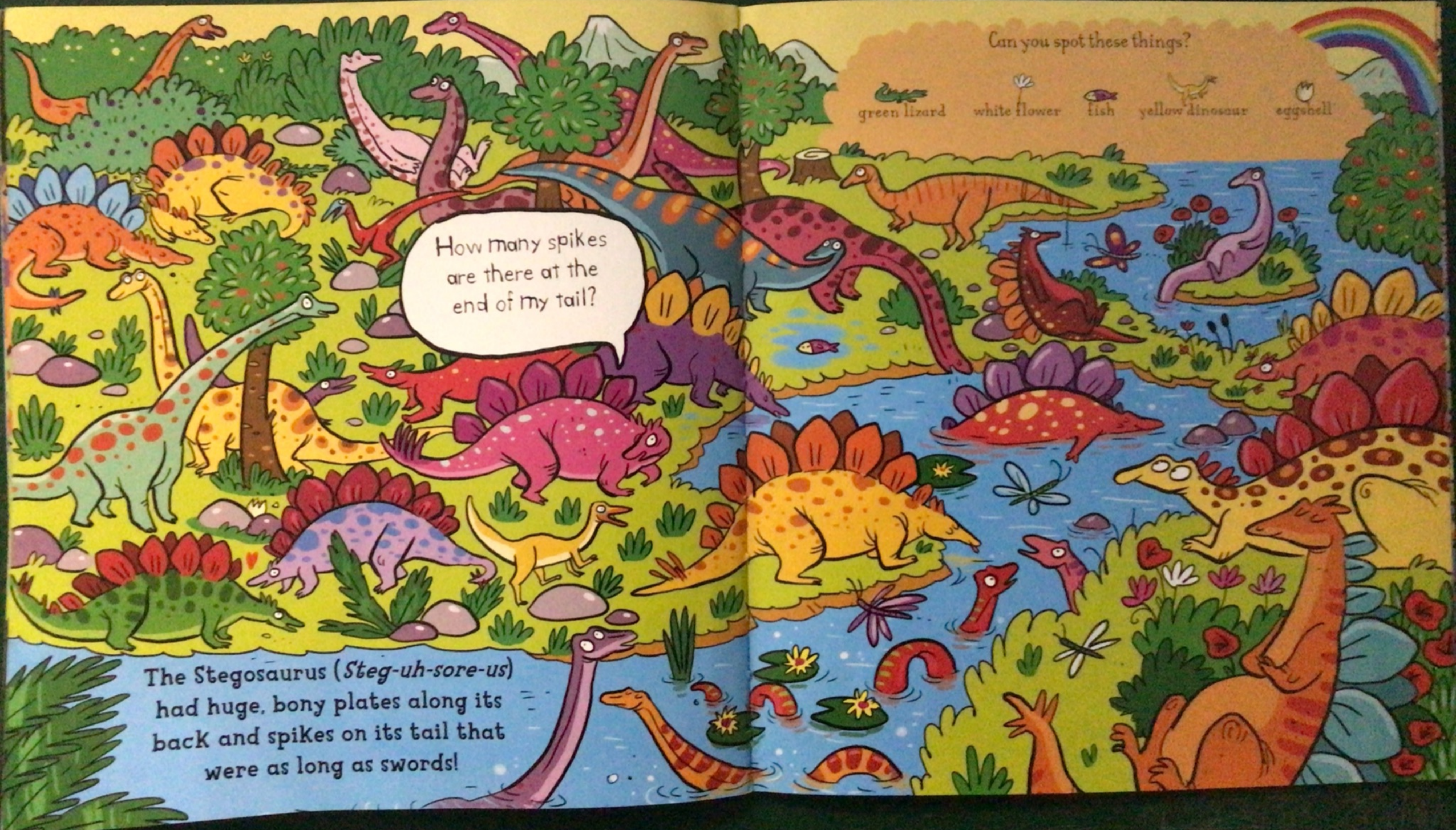

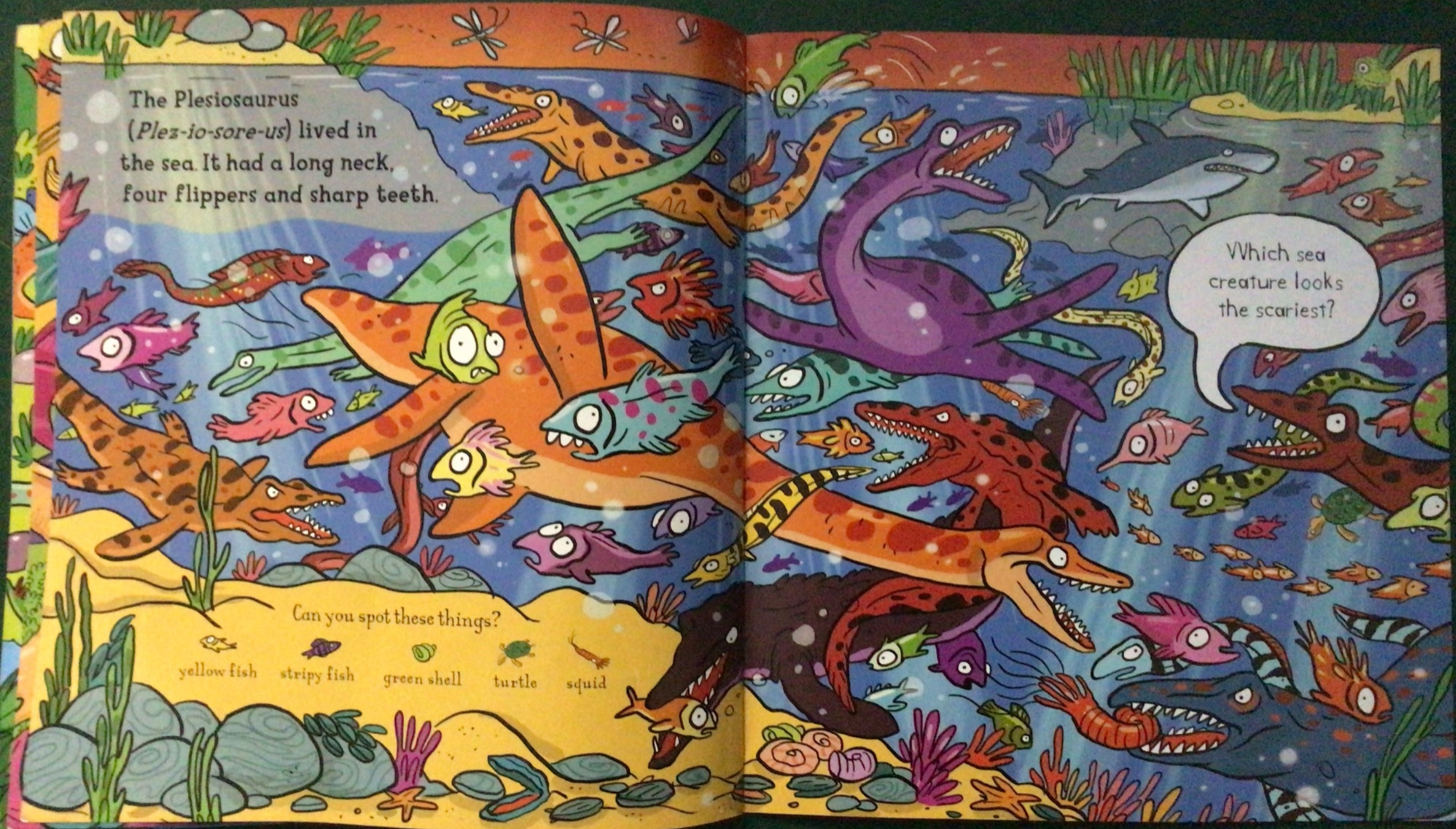

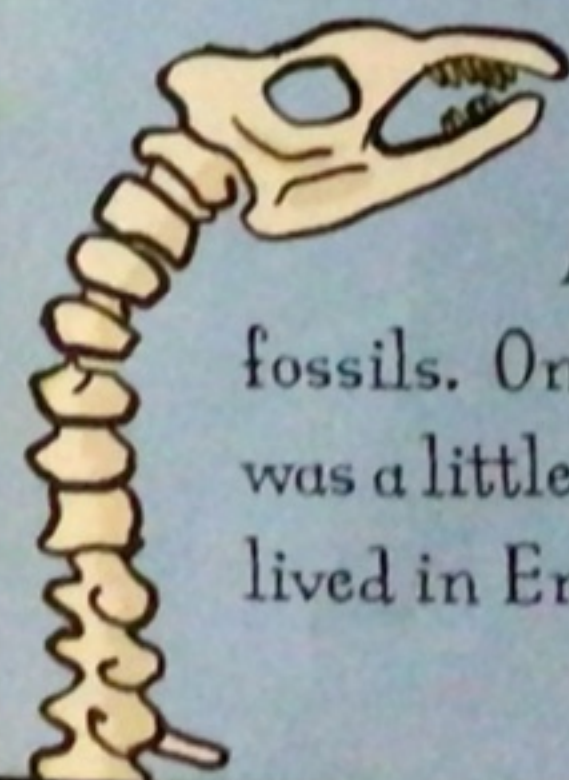
Did you know?

Some of the dinosaurs' closest relatives are still around today. You might see one if you look out of your window. They're birds!

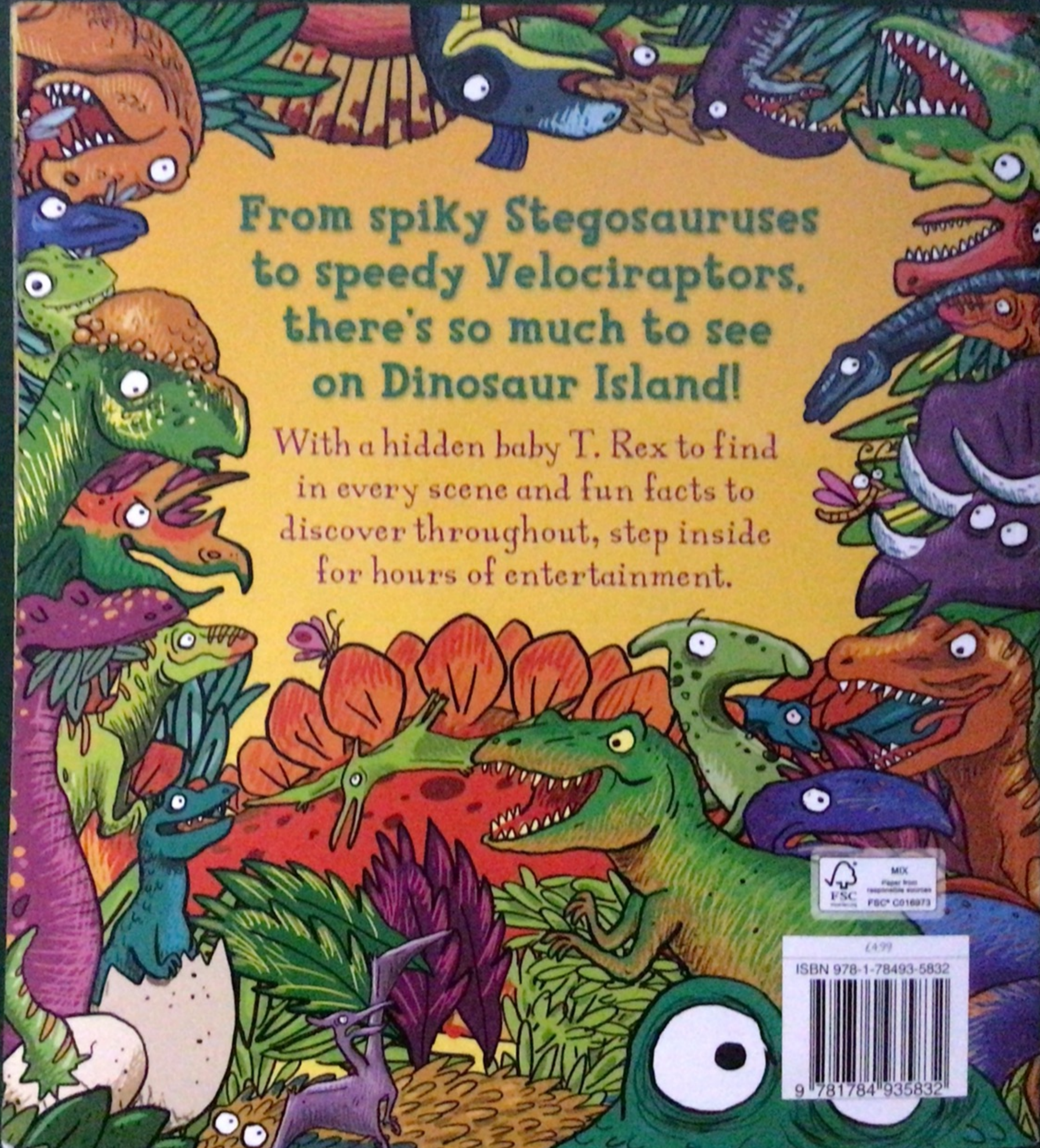
No one is certain what colour dinosaurs were, but we know that some had feathers and most of them had scaly skin.
