But the trees didn’t have a blanket swing.



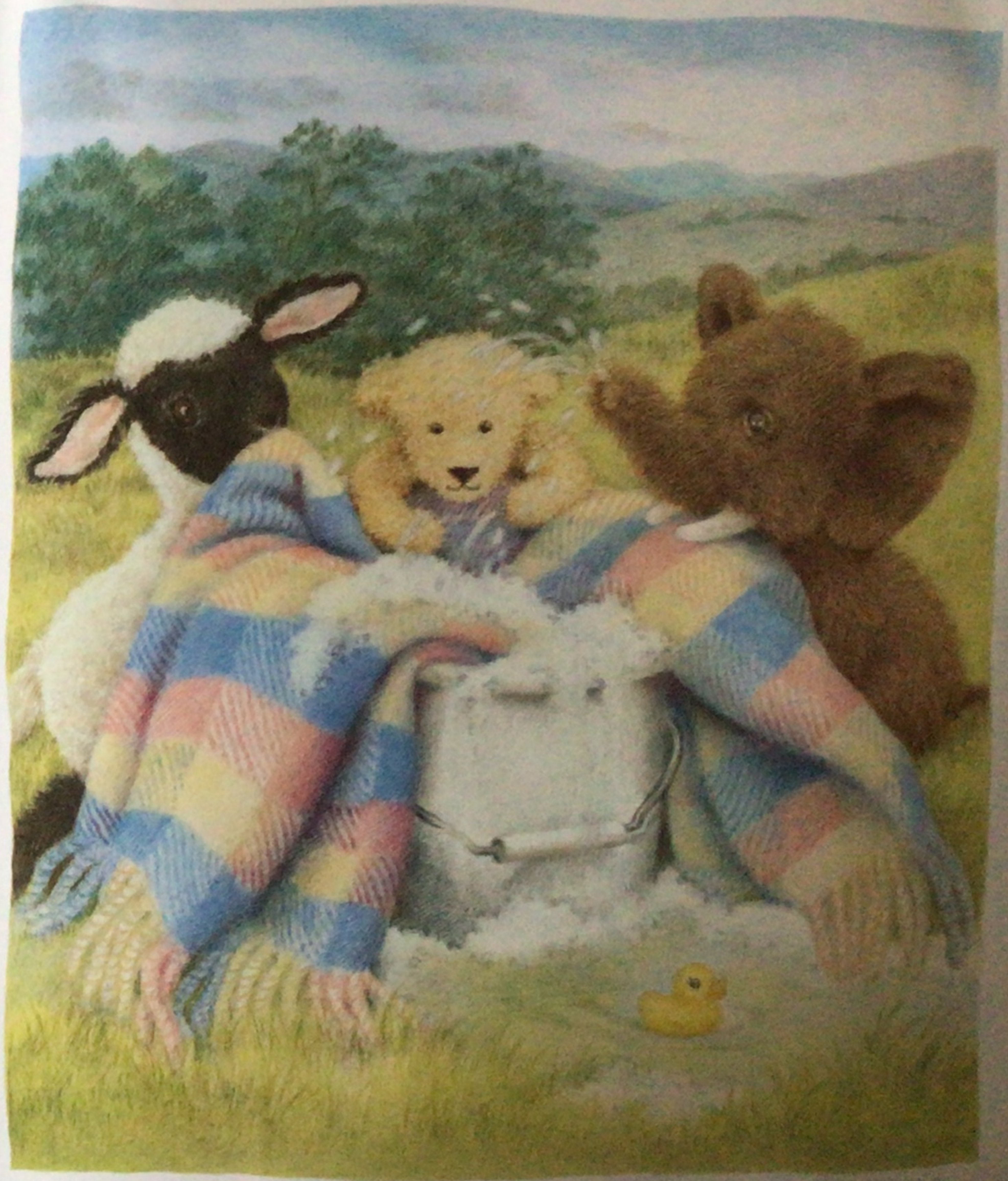
“We must have done something else...” said Lulu.

“Oh!” cried Harry. “NOW I REMEMBER!

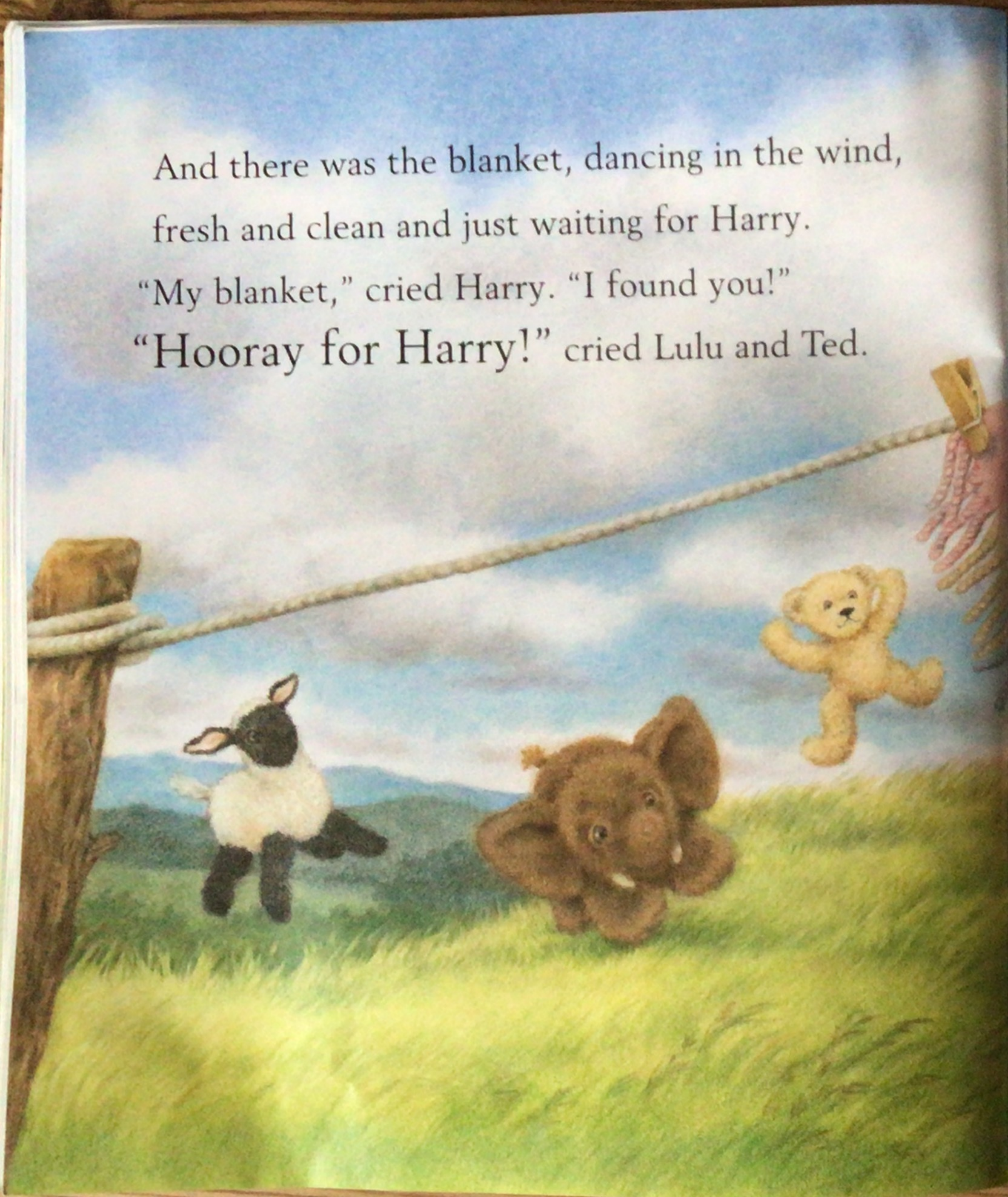
We hung my blanket to dry!”
