1. After School Clubs

After school clubs are extra-curricular in nature. In other words, they compliment the work that goes on in school throughout the week. Some like our Homework Club that is run in partnership with Queen's University Belfast help support children's learning. Others, like Monkeynastix for our P1-3 pupils, encourage children's health and fitness and complement school's extensive PE curriculum. Others, like Choir promote musicality while Movie Club is designed to be relaxing.

Although Cregagh PS is a small school (in city terms) with a small number of staff, we still manage to offer 7 different clubs throughout the week. This compares very favourably with other local schools and better than most. These clubs are <u>not</u> intended to provide an alternative to after-school-hours childcare and only children who want to attend, should attend.

Cregagh children are very fortunate to be surrounded with other out-of-school club options: such as the After School Club run by Donna and her staff in the Community Centre next door, as well as all the other Youth Clubs and Organisations in the local area that run in the early evenings: EA Youth Club with David Logan in the Community Centre, local football, rugby and cricket clubs; not to forget about all the terrific Guides, Scouts, BB and GB groups that meet in the surrounding churches. All-in-all, Cregagh children are <u>very</u> well catered for: both by the primary school and our community partners. There is something for everyone!

2. Preschool education in the Cregagh area

Authorities say East Belfast has lots of preschool places available to families. The problem is, not many of them are close to Cregagh and the few that are, are very often full. Cregagh Primary School and our local area needs a nursery class as part of this school. Children need the very best start to their educational journeys as possible. Nursery classes have fully trained teachers and are properly funded by government. Nursery school children can avail of things such as school meals and can access all the resources belonging to the rest of the school.

I am continuing to pursue this with the Department of Education, ELBs/Education Authority and locally elected politicians. I have already recruited support from various quarters but may well reach out to you parents in the future for your <u>practical</u> help and support. Watch this space.

We hope that the current building works will be complete by the end of April.

4. After School Childcare - September 2024


Only 3 parents expressed interest in using Wrap Around care as provided by Sleepy Hollow and their associated costs.

We are now looking at other ways of providing some level of affordable, quality after-school-childcare to parents and children: possibly starting with care until 5pm. I will keep parents informed. If there is not sufficient demand, it simply cannot be done. We have a growing number of working parents but not everyone can afford to pay for childcare. There may however, be government help available to those who would use such a service.
