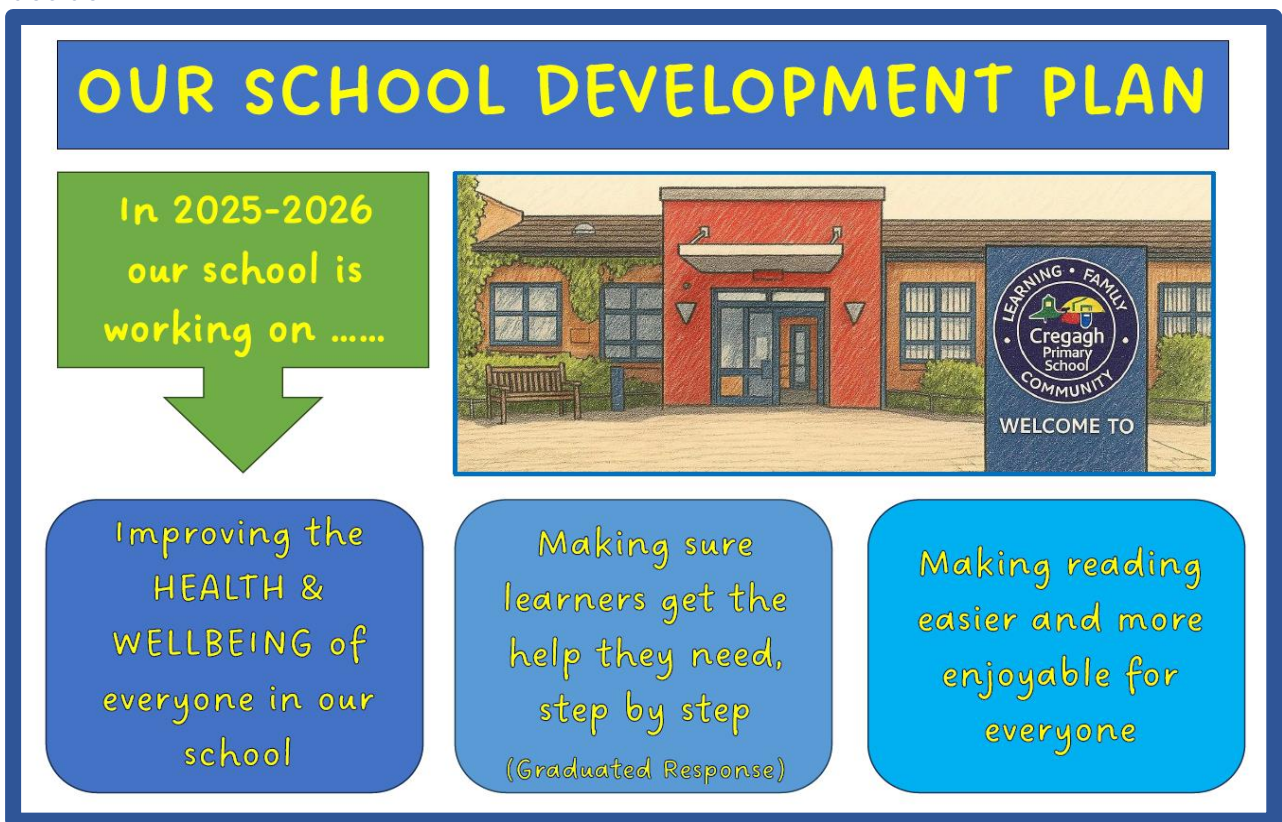




1. School Development Priorities 2025-26
