Our advice would be that families typically aim to complete written tasks on a Monday and a Wednesday afternoon, whilst practising spellings, numbers and high frequency words every day to ensure good retention. Reading with your child is vital, so we would ask parents and carers to read with children when books are sent home from school (usually two times per week), along with other home stories too.
