### **Competition Bye-Laws**

### **Verse Speaking Section (Primary)**

- 1. In all cases, entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by appropriate fees.
- 2. Competitors will be admitted free only to the session in which they compete.
- 3. Competitors may obtain particulars of their marks after each class on the day of competition.
- 4. No competitor may perform the same piece in more than one class.
- 5. a) All members of Choral Speaking must be bona fide members of the group on the day of entry.
  - b) In the cases of school groups, members must be on the particular school's rolls on the day of entry.
- 6. In Junior or Juvenile competition proof of age must be produced if required and competitors must be of age stated on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025
- 7. a) Prizes will be withheld if sufficient merit is not shown.
  - b) In all classes there must be at least 3 entries per class to constitute a competition except in Class No. 43 Group Mime.
- 8. Any protest against the infringement of the Bye-Laws or against a competitor, must be accompanied by a fee of £20 which will be returned only if the protest is upheld by the Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 9. Competitors must provide own choice selections and copies of poems and plays for the adjudicator.
- 10. Competitors must not perform the same piece in two consecutive years.
- In all classes competitors must not perform any set piece set by the adjudicator for the Primary and Private section as a favourite poem in Private classes in the same year.
- 12. Any competitor receiving private tuition may not enter in the Primary School classes.
- 13. All prizes including certificates of merit are awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator whose decision is final.
- 14. All entries for competitions are accepted subject to these Bye-Laws.
- 15. Entries will be accepted on the website only.
- 16. No late entries will be accepted after closing date: Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December 2024

All entrants must be taught and entered by Primary School teachers.

<u>Pupils receiving outside private professional tuition may not enter Primary School</u> Section.

It is the teacher's responsibility to ensure that pupils entered in the 'Primary School Section' are not receiving outside professional tuition.
