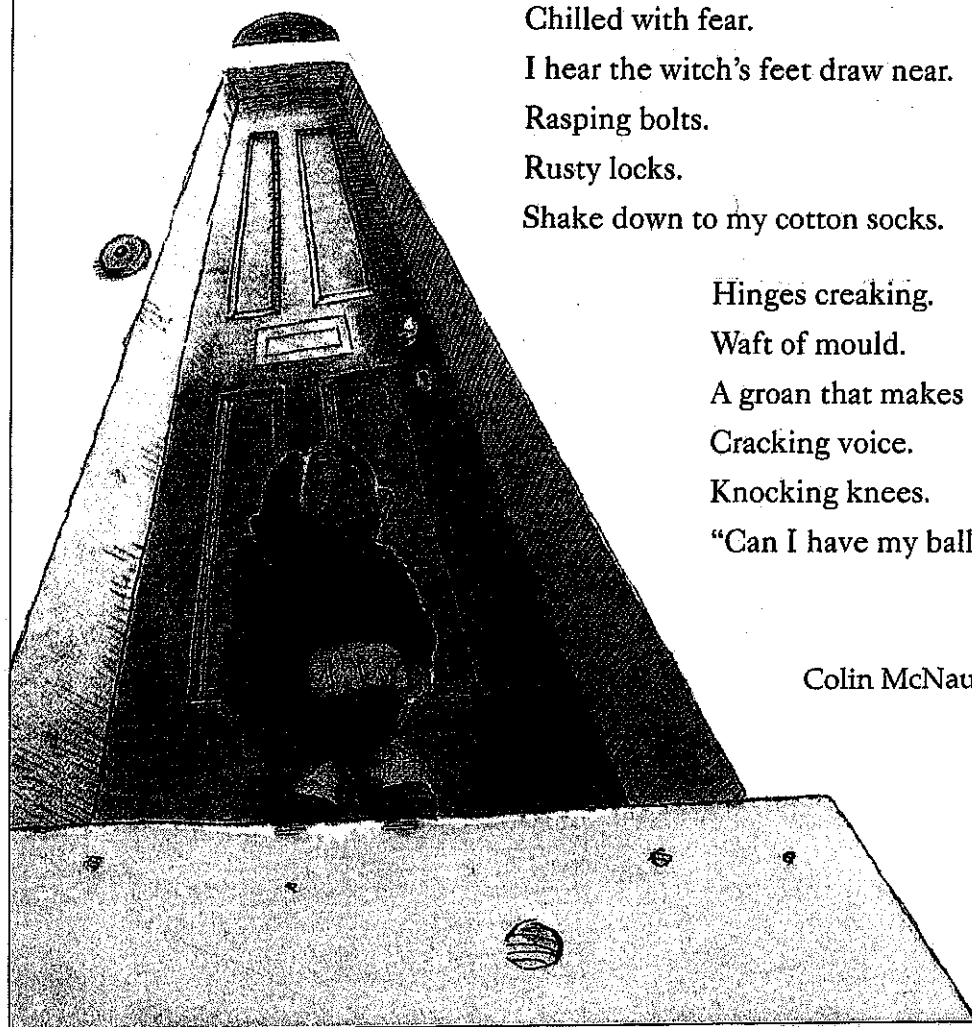
MRS MATHER

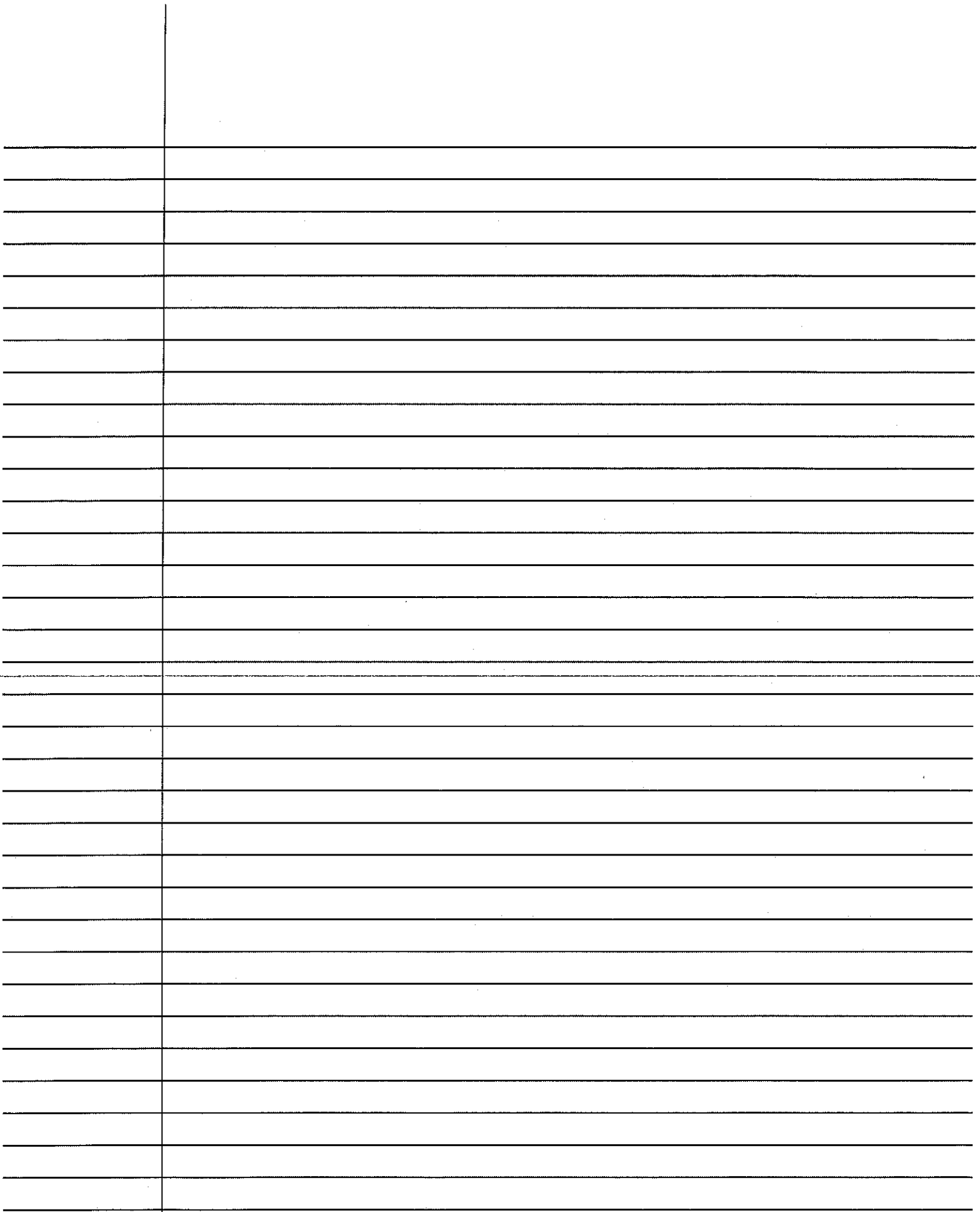

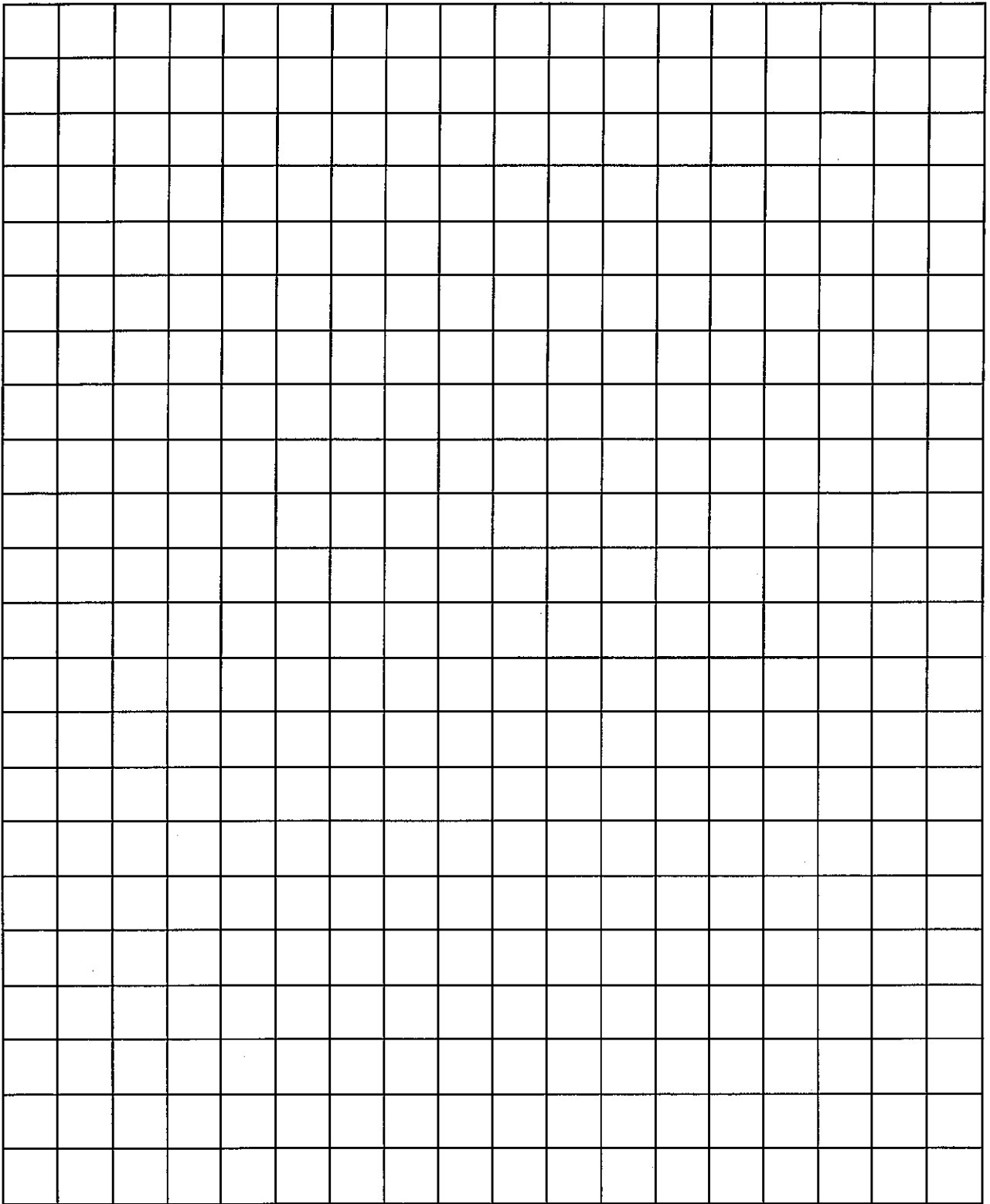
